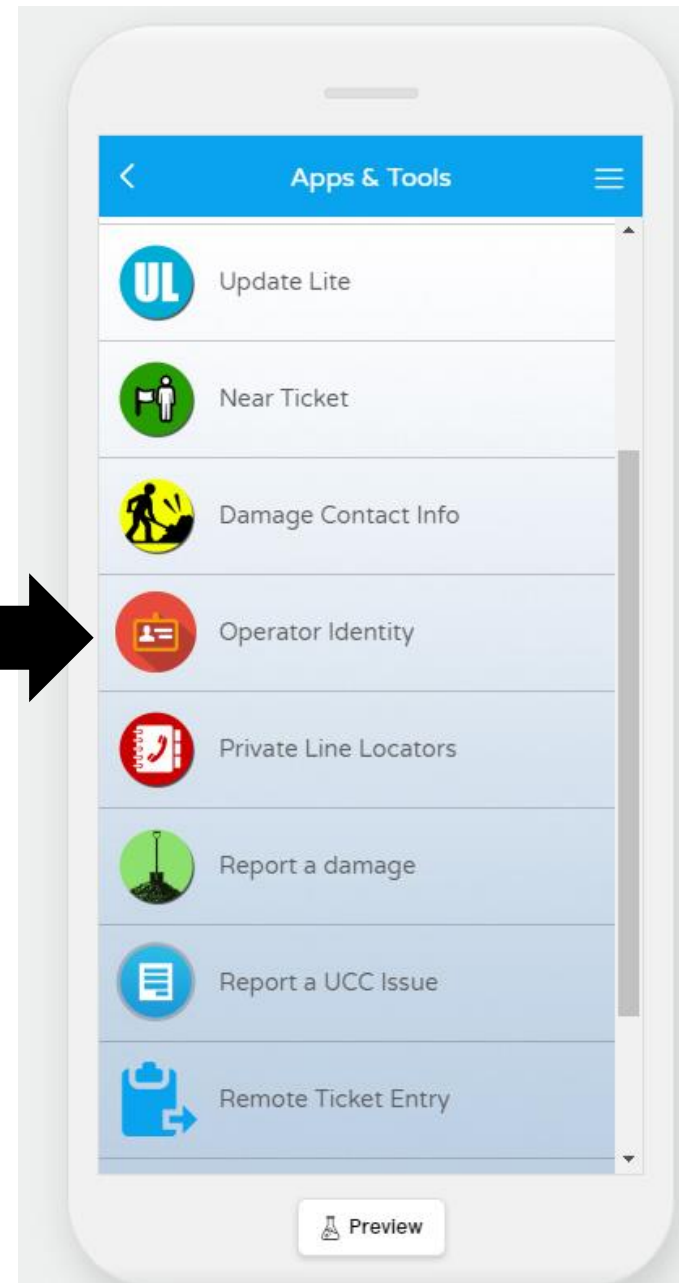
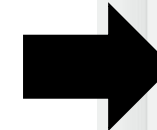

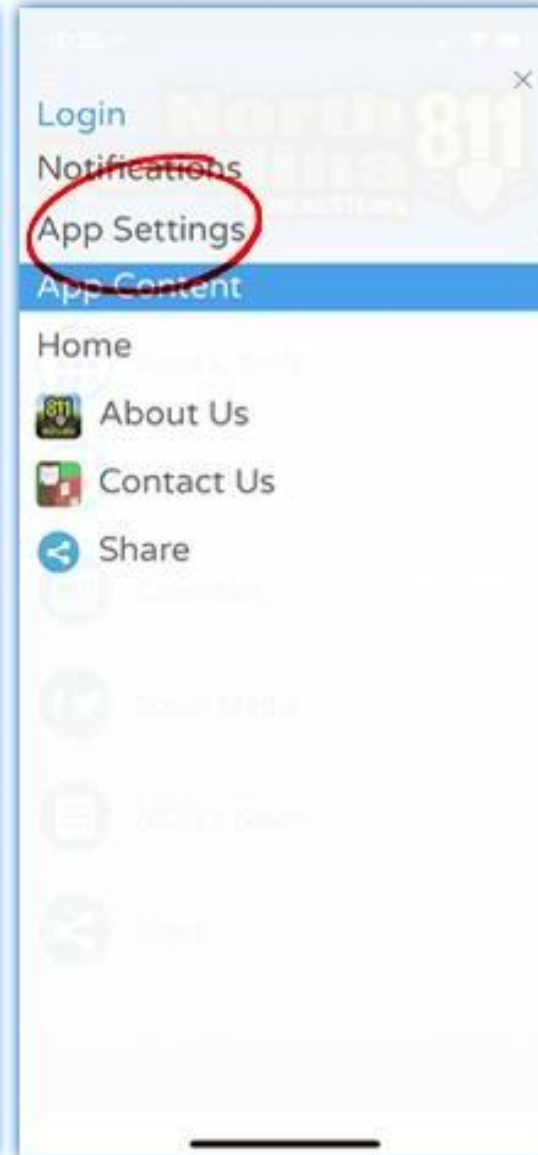

PLEASE NOTE

If the diameter or width of the facility is greater than four inches, the dimension of the facility shall be indicated at least every 50 feet in the area of the proposed excavation or demolition. An operator who operates multiple facilities in the area of the proposed excavation or demolition shall locate each facility.

The operator's identity, marked as provided in subdivision (1) of this subsection, in the area where the proposed excavation or demolition is to occur. At a minimum, the operator's identity shall be marked at the beginning point, at intervals of 200 linear feet, and at the end point of the proposed excavation or demolition.

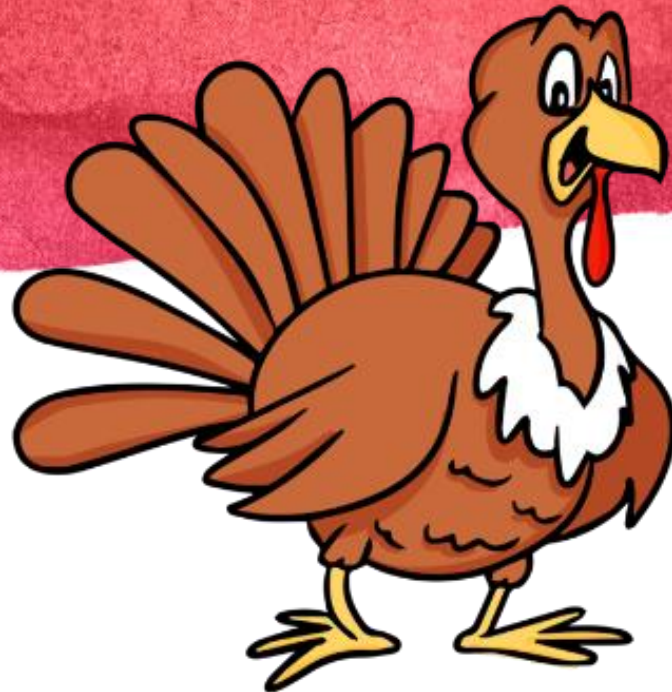

Will Ellis & Ronnie Suttles – City of Morganton: Working on wintertime issues. A lot of problems with damages to water and sewer underground pipes from the Facebook underground conduit installations in our area.

Tommy Chapman – REMC: Recently had their Annual Membership Meeting. Very good attendance. Continue to work on the 100,000 voltage Transmission lines between Cathy Road and US Highway 64 South. Also working to get their system ready for the winter months.

David Wortman – Town of Rhodhiss: Nothing to report.

David Perkins – Brentwood Water: Doing routine maintenance to equipment and the system. Getting ready for the winter month that are upon us. Selling new taps and fixing some leaks.

Ken & Doug Suttles – Suttles Surveying: Still working on the Lake James dam project and DOT Bridge replacement on Sugar Hill Road at I-40 intersection.
