Reports

CenturyLink – There were no attendees today.

Piedmont Natural Gas – Gerald Bobbitt and Joe Keily reported that there were no major projects at this time; however, they are continuing to work on scattered projects throughout Newport. A main distribution line is forthcoming.

Town of Atlantic Beach – Paige Taylor-Ward reported the Town Park is constructing a new well, bathroom facilities, and concession stand. The new lighting plan has been completed. A new Public Works Building is being built on West Fort Macon Road. The Lookouts at the Grove is progressing as well as the new subdivision, Seaside Villas, on the former Jungleland property. The drainage projects have been completed. A big thank you to Duke Energy Progress is in order for all of their assistance with these projects.

Town of Beaufort – Donovan Willis, Public Works Director, reported that they are performing routine maintenance as well as preparing for an upcoming boring project in conjunction with CenturyLink.

Town of Emerald Isle – There were no attendees today.

Town of Pine Knoll Shores – Sonny Cunningham, Public Works Director, who was unable to attend, reported that they are continuing to install water meters and a curb gutter.

Town of Morehead City – Anthony Joyner and Shaun Brinson reported that they are performing routine maintenance, repairing water leaks, and the five (5) mile force main pipeline project starts in mid-March and should be completed within two-hundred seventy (270) days.

Town of Newport – There were no attendees today.

Carteret County Water – John Nevill and Bud White were unable to attend, but reported that they are performing routine maintenance and repairing water leaks.

West Carteret Water Corp. – Kent Jones reported that they are working on the tie-in at Highway 58 at Pelletier as well as Bogue Forest.

Pamlico County Water Services – Paul Campbell, who was unable to attend, reported that they are performing routine maintenance.

Duke Energy Progress – Betty Barnes and Allen Huffman reported that they are performing routine maintenance as well as working on Lennoxville Road and Beau Coast.

Carteret Craven Electric Membership Cooperative – There were no attendees today.

NC DOT – John Butler reported that the new traffic signals have been placed into service and they have double red lights. The new lights were placed in service on Highway 70 because of truck heights and clearance issues when travelling to the Port.

Time Warner Cable/Charter Communications/Spectrum – There were no attendees today.

USIC – Jeff Parker reported that tickets are averaging forty plus (40+) tickets per day for locate requests. There were 260 tickets yesterday and 220 tickets today. There are no local job openings; however, there are openings in Charlotte, Raleigh and Wilmington.

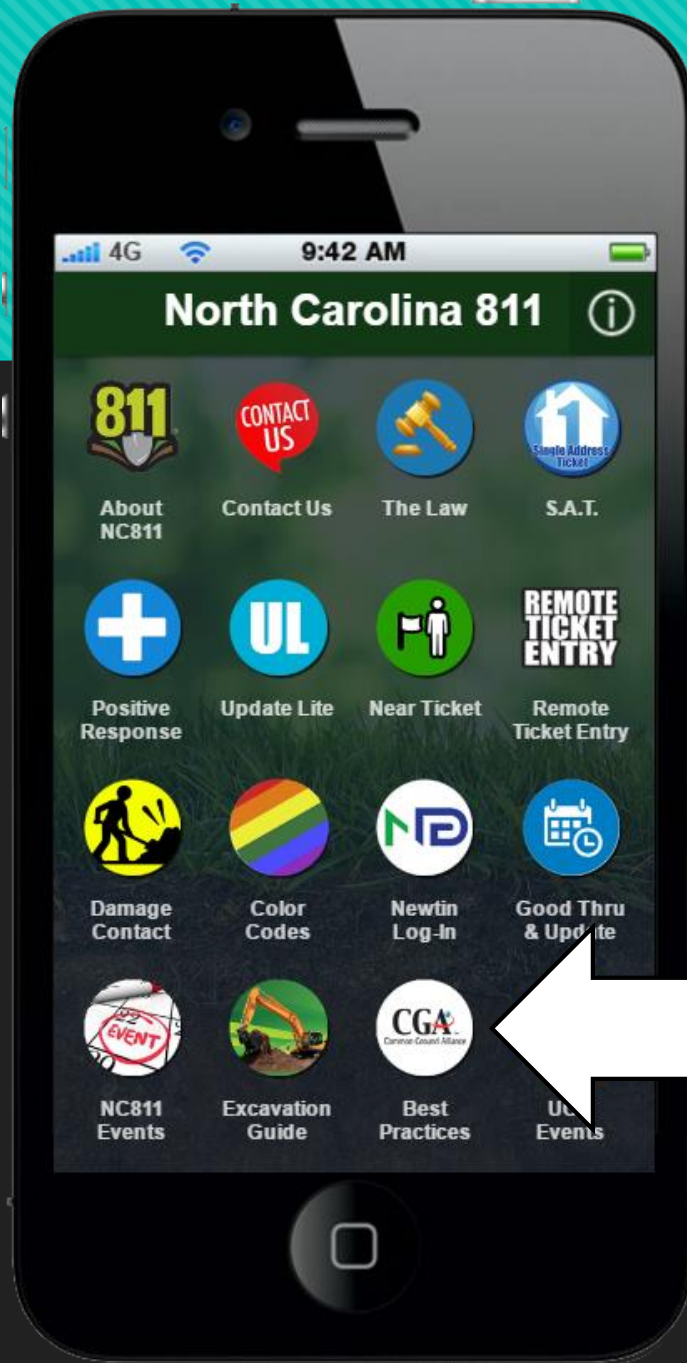
