### Call to Order

The May 10<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Carteret County UCC was called to order by our Chair, Paige Taylor-Ward, with eighteen (18) members in attendance. The roster is attached.

### Old Business

### New Business

### Reports

CenturyLink – There were no attendees today.

Piedmont Natural Gas – Joe Keily and Danny Lewis reported that three (3) miles of pipe are being placed at Cannon's Gate in Cape Carteret, and that they are continuing to work on scattered projects and services throughout the county.

Town of Atlantic Beach – Paige Taylor-Ward reported that they are continuing preparations for the upcoming season, including the Beach Music Festival on Saturday, May 20, Memorial Day fireworks on Saturday, May 27, at 9:00 pm at the Circle, Crystal Coast Music Festival on Saturday, June 3, and the Town Park Grand Opening on Saturday, June 10. A new Public Works Building is being built on West Fort Macon Road. The Lookouts at the Grove is progressing as well as the new subdivision, Seaside Villas, on the former Jungleland property. The AMR project was completed in-house over a period of five (5) years with SCADA to follow.

Town of Beaufort – Donovan Willis, Public Works Director, reported that they are preparing for the influx of summer visitors as well as developing new subdivisions. They are as follows: Front Street Village, Beau Coast, and Beaufort Club (Formerly North River Club). Additionally, the developer of Front Street Village will begin construction of the new hotel (inn and bistro) next month.

Town of Emerald Isle – Artie Dunn, Public Works Director, was unable to attend because they are enlarging their stormwater system. The new pumps are scheduled for start-up at 11 am today. They are also preparing for visitors and the upcoming summer season.

Town of Pine Knoll Shores – Sonny Cunningham, Public Works Director, reported that they are installing ten (10) large water meters and they are installing a new eighty foot (80') flagpole at the Fire Department.

Town of Morehead City – Anthony Joyner and Shaun Brinson reported that they are continuing to perform routine maintenance, repair water leaks, and the five (5) mile force main pipeline is progressing.

Town of Newport – There were no attendees today.

Carteret County Water – John Nevill and Bud White were unable to attend, but reported that they are performing routine maintenance and repairing water leaks.

West Carteret Water Corp. – Lisa Smith-Perri was unable to attend, as she is attending the Annual Rural Water Conference in Greensboro; however, they are continuing to work on Highway 58 and will hopefully finish this portion of the project. Additionally, they're currently working on Nine Mile Road, and they will begin the subdivisions on Highway 24 in the ocean area within the next few weeks.

Pamlico County Water Services – Paul Campbell, who was unable to attend, reported that they are performing routine maintenance.

Duke Energy Progress – Robert Lynch and Betty Barnes reported that they are performing infrastructure maintenance, pole change outs in Atlantic and moving lines in Beaufort.

Carteret Craven Electric Membership Cooperative – There were no attendees today.

NC DOT – John Butler was unable to attend due to a conflicting schedule.

Time Warner Cable/Charter Communications/Spectrum – There were no attendees today.

USIC – Jeff Parker reported that they are in the busy season averaging fifty plus (50+) tickets per day for locate requests. There were 260 tickets yesterday and 220 tickets today.

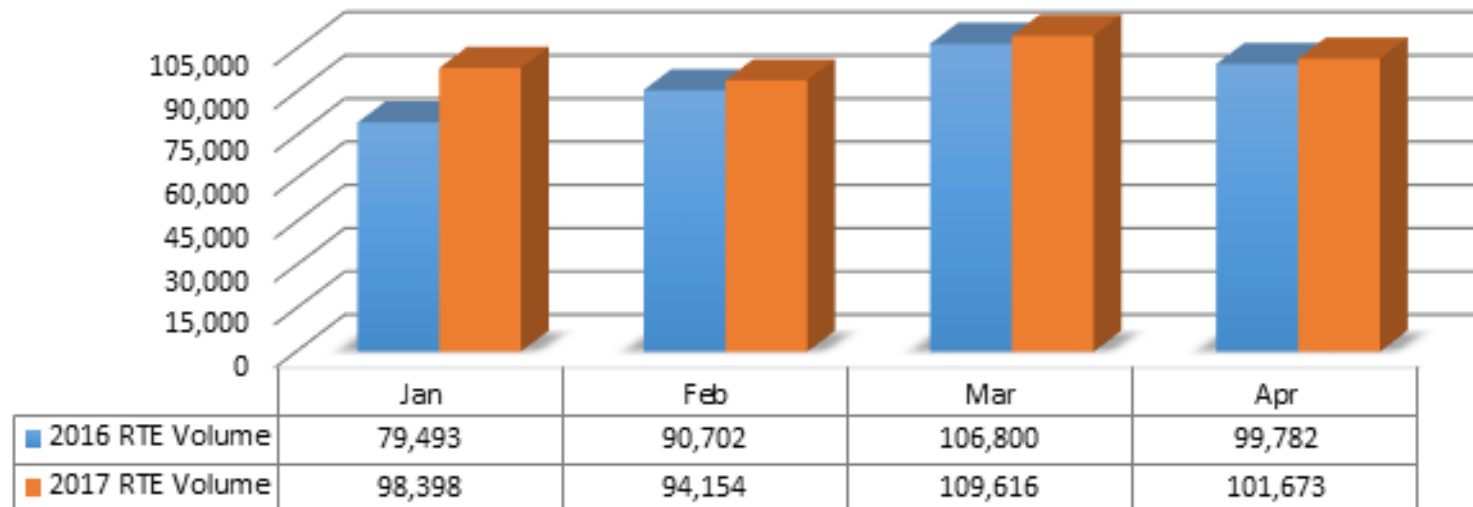

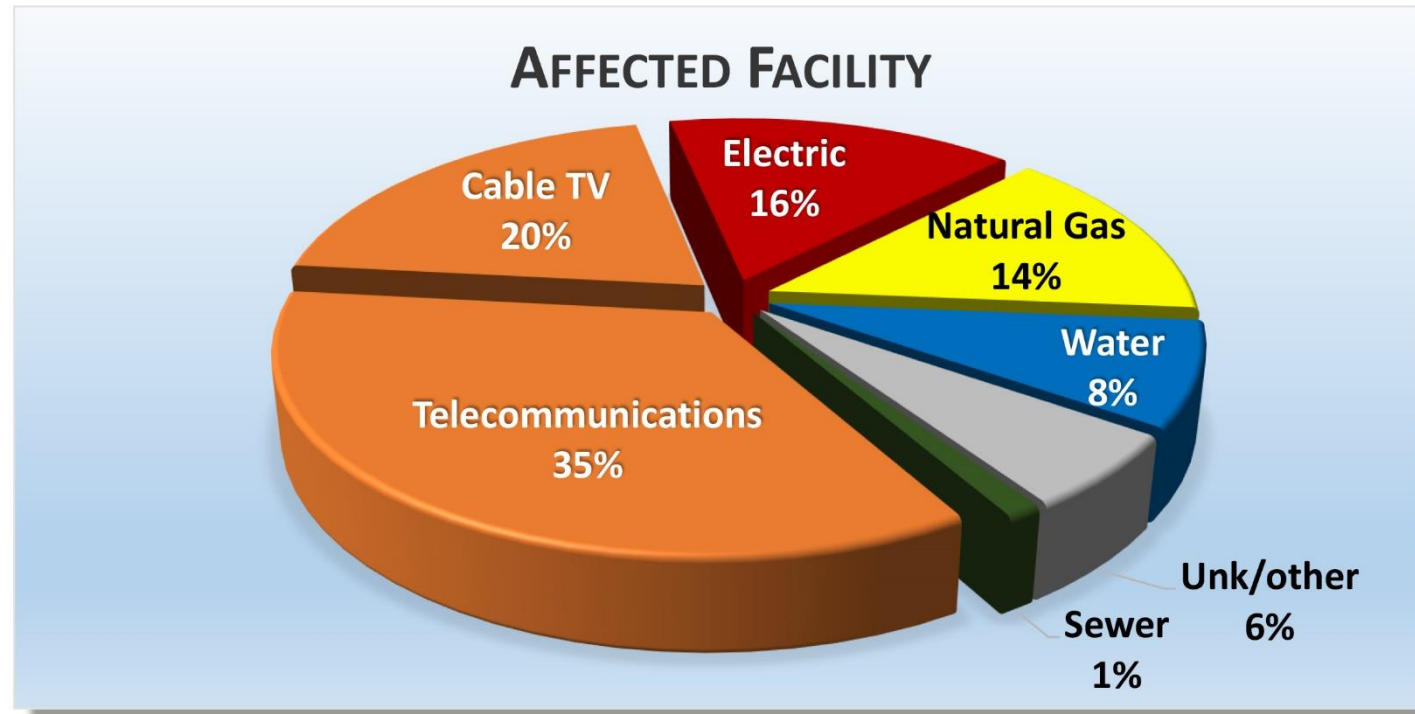
RTE Volume 2017 vs 2016

**NC811, April 2017: 528 Damage Events in 49 Counties**

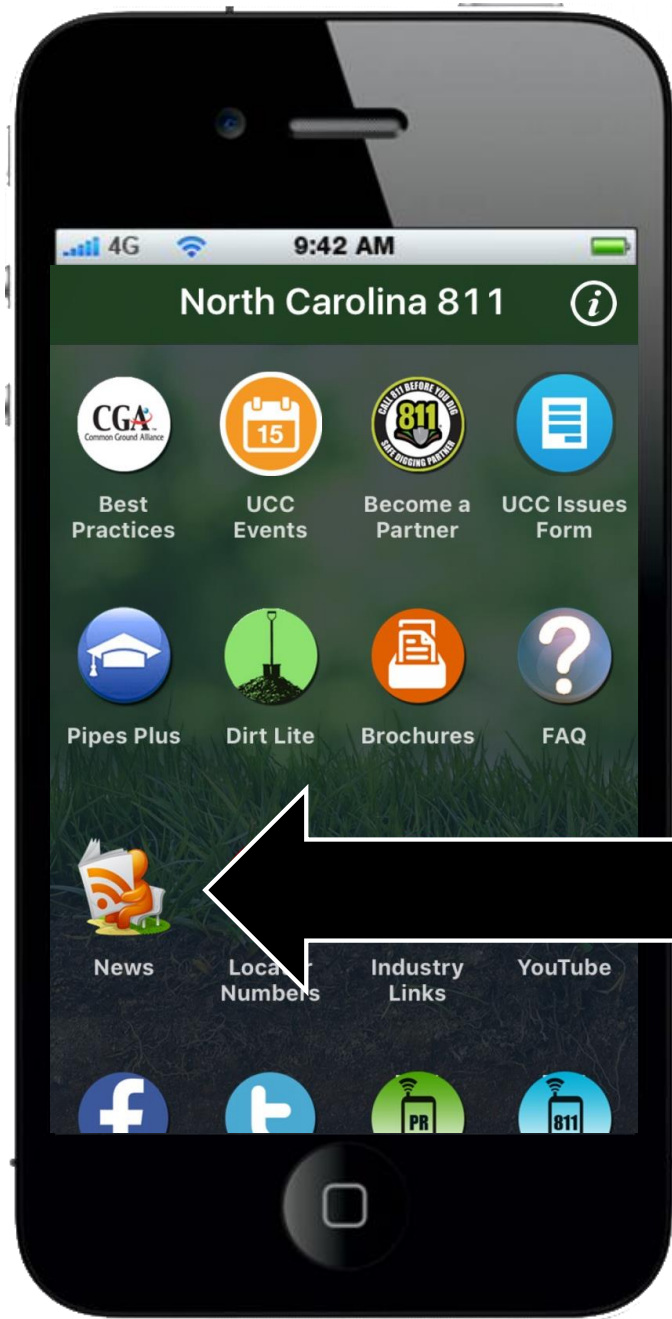

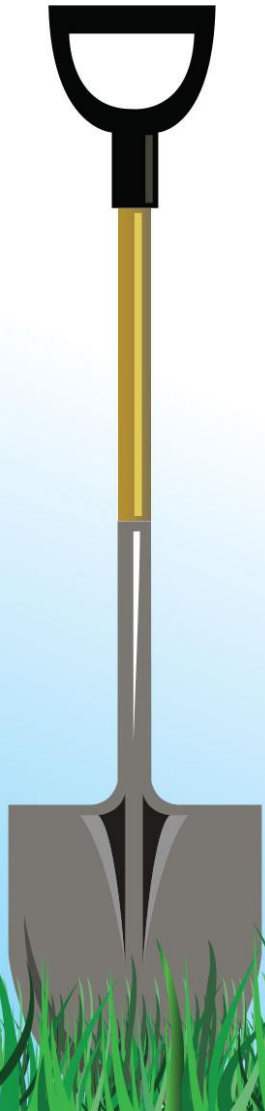
