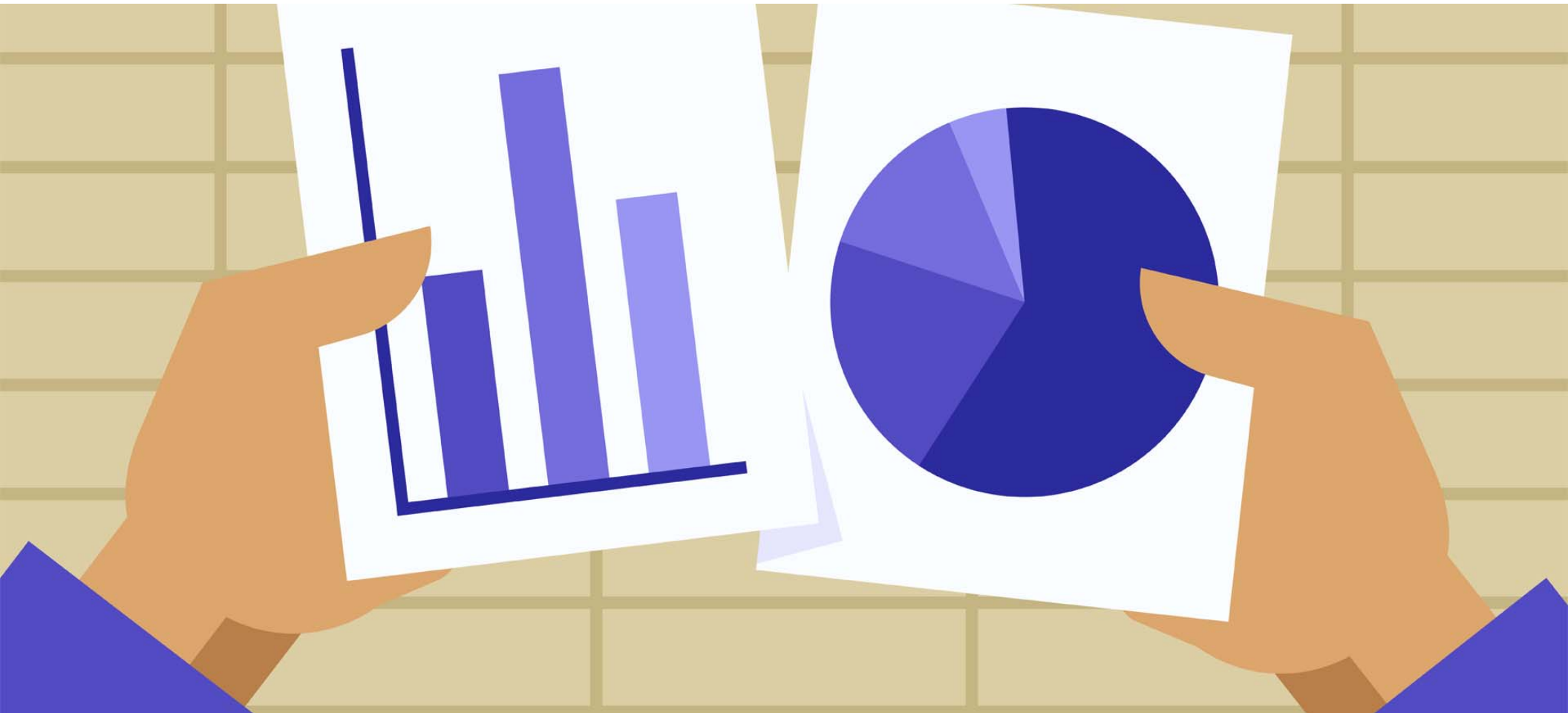

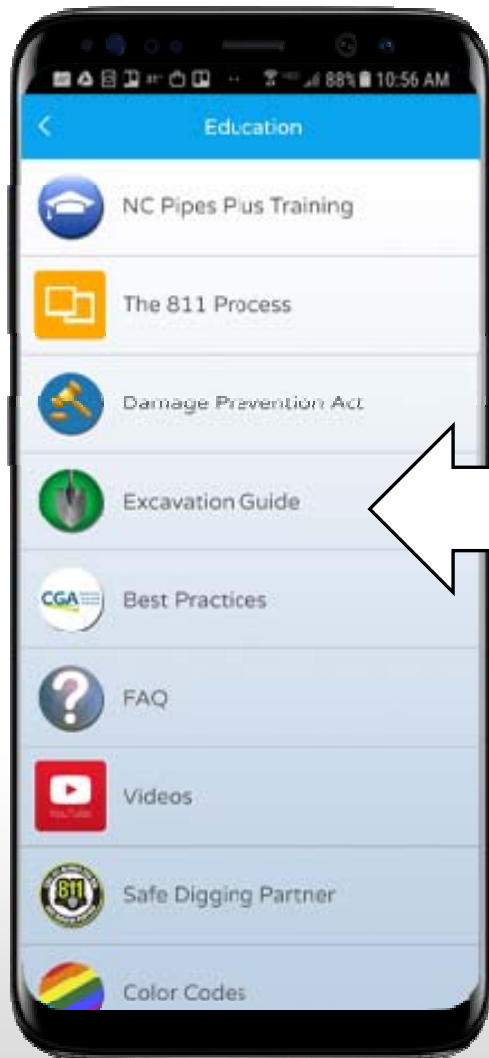

Meeting Time: The meeting was called to order by the secretary, Dylan Kirk at 9:00 a.m. Introductions were made and then Dylan performed a level one safety checklist.

Total Members Present: There were Eleven members.

Recent Damages: There were no significant damages that this group were aware, within Guilford County, that these members were aware of.

New Business and Projects:

Rob Sledge, with SEC, stated they are currently in the process of replacing old steel lines throughout Greensboro. Rob stated that this project should be completed by the end of August. Dylan Kirk, with USIC, stated they are extremely busy with the abundance of locate tickets. Dylan stated that the majority of the locate requests are coming from both the MCI / Verizon and the AT&T fiber installations. Dylan also stated that as of April 4th, USIC, will no longer be locating for CenturyLink. Don Langley, with NCDOT, stated they are having difficulty in getting various utility lines relocated within their projects. Joe Hatch, City of High Point, stated they are having a difficult time with the MCI and AT&T projects. City only has two locators and they are struggling to keep up with the locate requests. Joe, also stated, that High Point is experiencing a fair amount of damages created by these two projects.

NC811 Presentation:

Kevin Smith gave the NC811 presentation and gave considerable time on the importance of contractors not requesting multiple three hour locate requests at the same time. Kevin also reviewed the NC811 app and went over that the excavation guide is conveniently located on the NC app. He stressed the importance of having the "App" as one of the most important tools all utility personnel could have.

General Discussion:

Group had a generalized conversation concerning the pace of locate requests and were concerned as the reality of the current NC811 system's ability to handle the workload.
