Lee Electrical– Project North of Lillington from Raven Rock to the substation for South River EMC.

Discussion

Kevin Smith presented the NC811 report. Per Kevin, NC811 had an Open House at their new office. He also showed a 2018 NC811 recap video that showed a lot of the ways that they have tried to get the message to “Call 811” out to the public through advertising and partnering with businesses like Lowes. Kevin asked that if anyone knows of a school or community college that has a construction program, he would like to know so that he can reach out to them and possibly give a presentation to the students. Locate requests for Harnett County were up 24.5% from last year and in Johnston County they were up 23.6%. Overall locate requests year to date were up 23.2% from January 2018. RTE usage continues to increase, if you would like to get set up to use RTE please see Kevin. Per Kevin, 58% of damages have been to telecommunications/ cable TV lines. He reminded everyone that the NC811 App has damage contact information. Please remember that your locate ticket description needs to match the white lined area, locators are required to locate the area described on the ticket. If the ticket says entire property for example, that is what the locator has to locate even if a small area is white lined. This backs the entire system up and causes delays in locates being completed. Kevin spent a day in the field with a locator with USIC, he stressed the importance of clear complete instructions on your locate tickets. It’s frustrating for utilities and contractors when they have to wait for locates but it is also very frustrating for the locator who is trying to interpret what they need to locate and because of this the locate process takes even longer. It is also very important to put a good phone number on the locate so they can reach you in the event of questions. This is also a good reason to attend UCC meetings, you can make valuable contacts that can help you in your day to day work. Kevin also reminded everyone that after you wait the 3 working days and locate is not done, then you call in a 3 hour ticket, if you see no sign of utilities, you can dig; however if you see evidence of a utility you cannot dig or you will be liable for damages. Kevin presented a video with “Bad Weather Driving Tips”. The full NC811 presentation is attached to these minutes.

Andrew reminded everyone that the Annual Contractor’s Awareness/Damage Prevention Breakfast is coming up on March 19th. NC811, Lee Electrical & PNG are paying for the caterer. If you can help with the door prizes or handouts for the bags please let us know. Robert Yu with USIC and Kevin Smith with NC811 will be our speakers for this event. Tim with the Town of Clayton asked if he still has to locate the entire property if he contacts the contractor/utility and asks about the exact area needed. Per Kevin with NC811, he is not an attorney and can’t interpret that but a locate ticket is a legal binding document.

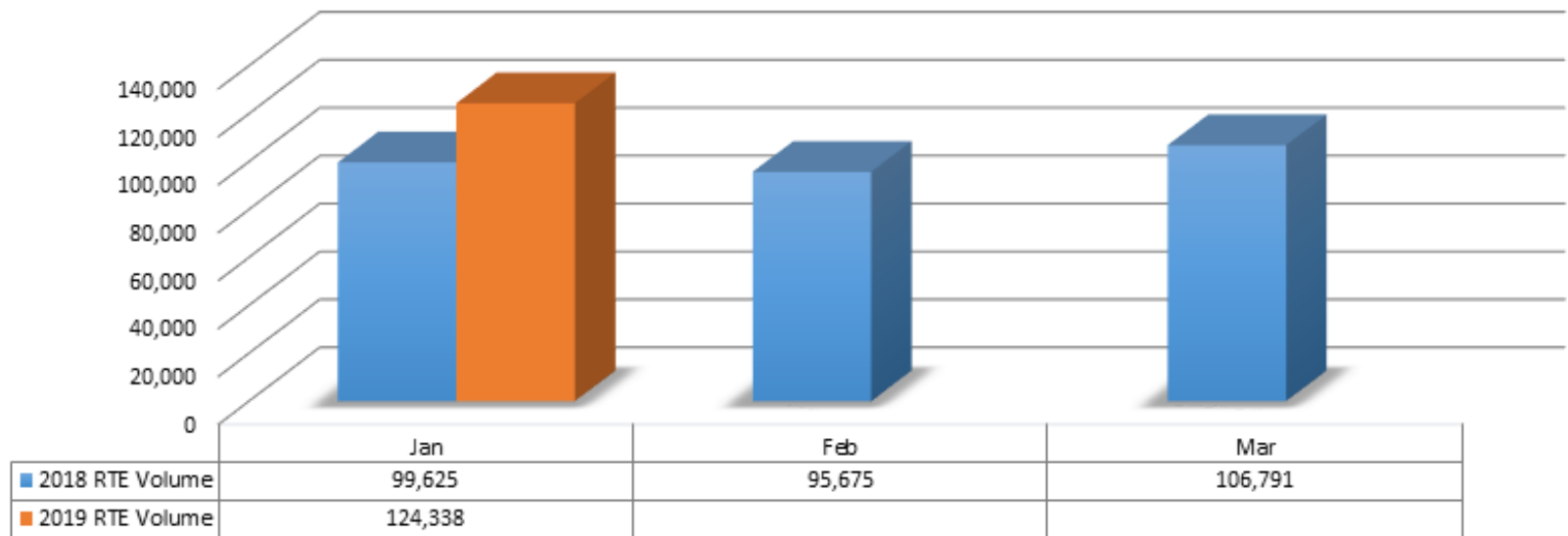

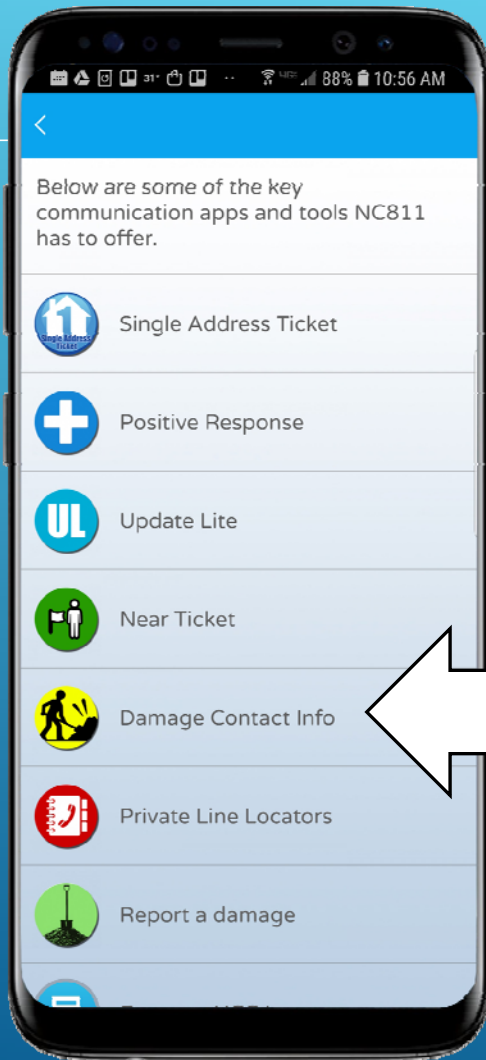

Destroyed Marks & 3 Hour Tickets

DESTROYED MARKS

If locate marks have been destroyed, the excavator must contact NC811 to issue a Destroyed Marks ticket requesting a remark of the area from the original ticket. A 3 Hour Ticket should not be used in case of destroyed marks.

3 HOUR TICKET

If an operator fails to respond to the positive response system, the excavator may proceed if there are no visible indications of a facility at the proposed excavation or demolition area, such as a pole, marker, pedestal, meter, or valve. However, if the excavator is aware of or observes indications of an unmarked facility at the proposed excavation or demolition area, the excavator shall not begin excavation or demolition until an additional call is made to the Notification Center detailing the facility and an arrangement is made for the facility to be marked by the operator within three hours from the time the additional call is received by the Notification Center.

Bad Weather Driving Tips

- Inspect their vehicles before departing. Check tires, lights, turn signals, wipers, windows, defroster, mirrors and loads. Report defects to the mechanic and have them repaired before you go on the road.
- Keep windows and lights clean and clear of dirt, snow, and ice.
- Use wipers, defrosters, and headlights to improve your visibility day or night. Headlights also help other drivers see you.
- Avoid distractions, such as cell phones or radios.
- Watch out for puddles and icy patches that could cause hydroplaning or skids.
- Do not attempt to drive through deep puddles. You could get stuck or wet the brakes.
- Avoid quick or sudden stops or turns.
- Increase your stopping distance.
- Wear your seat belt at all times and require passengers to do the same. There is no time for mistakes during bad weather. Bad weather affects all drivers. You must stay alert. Watch out for the other drivers, too. Drive defensively!

Meeting Time: The meeting was called to order by the chairperson Kate Coker at 12:05 p.m.

Total Members Present: There were nine members present. Introductions were made and conversation turned to a safety minute.

Safety Minute: Kevin Smith, with NC811, shared an example of a damage that occurred when he worked for Ansco. Kevin stated a sub-contractor was not paying attention to a missile bore that was entering an open, excavated pit, when the missile struck and damaged a gas line. The person whom was responsible for looking for the missile, was on his cell phone and not watching what was happening.

New Projects: There were no new projects shared by any member at this meeting. NCDOT stated they have some roads that are in the process of being widened, however, there was nothing new to report in the way of projects.

Recent Damages: Ron Heath with Badger Daylighting, shared a quick damage story with the group. Ron stated that a contractor was in the process of excavating safely when they encountered a hard pack (clay) area and attempted to loosen the dirt with a mini excavator, when they pulled up a gas line with one simple scoop of their bucket.

NC811 Presentation:

Kevin Smith, with NC811, gave the monthly presentation and gave strong emphasis on the importance of having your ticket match the white lining and vice versa. He also covered some important features on the NC811 app and spent considerable time on the subject of calling in the correct locate request. Kevin reviewed the importance of all contractors only requesting locate tickets for areas that will be immediately worked. Companies calling in locates and updates for projects that will not start until months ahead, put an undue and unnecessary burden on the system.

General Discussion:

Kevin Smith, discussed the fatal accident that occurred in Raleigh a couple weeks' prior, involving an inadequate use or no use of shoring while excavating.

Group had a general discussion concerning the various company involvements and buyouts such as Duke Energy purchasing PNG and Dominion Energy purchasing PSNC. This then lead to the conversation on how this group can increase the overall attendance for this UCC. Kevin, encouraged the members who were present, to invite others within the utility industry to this meeting. Kate Coker, with Dominion Energy, stated to the group she had recently applied for a different position within Dominion and this would involve a relocation.
