SREMC – Subdivisions in Anderson Creek area.

NCDOT– Hwy 42 project and Hwy 70 upgrade in Johnston County, 2 bridge projects.

Discussion

Ann Rushing presented the NC811 report, April is safe digging month. Locate requests for Harnett County were down 16% from last year and in Johnston County they were down 11.7%. Overall locate requests year to date were down 9.5%. There were 637 damages reported in 61 counties in January of 2020 with communications lines being the most damaged. Ann showed a picture of a truck that was installing conduit for communications/cable lines and they had orange conduit, green conduit and blue conduit. She was just making us aware that they do use different colors, they also use yellow and red depending on how many lines are being put in. She also discussed the importance of making sure your locate tickets don't exceed the distance allowed for one locate; make sure you are up to date on the laws defining the distance that is allowed and how that relates to the parcel(s) that you need located. Ann also reminded everyone that if a locator needs additional information on a locate to complete it, they can enter code 32 and it will immediately be sent to the excavator alerting them of the need. Ann gave an update on the Underground Damage Prevention Review Board; she said that the top 50 transmission recipients will receive a bill to pay a portion of the cost to operate the UDPRB.

Andrew reminded everyone that the Annual Contractor's Awareness/Damage Prevention Breakfast is coming up on March 17th. NC811, Lee Electrical & Duke are paying for the caterer. If you can help with the door prizes or handouts for the bags please let us know. We are currently working on getting the speakers and hope to have someone from NCDOT speak about the I95 widening project as it relates to Harnett and Johnston Counties as well as someone from the Sheriff's department to speak about identifying the dangers field personnel face every day. Andrew reminded everyone to invite contractors to come to these meetings; the meetings provide a way to create relationships with other utilities and contractors that are vital. Any way that we can improve communication between utilities, contractors and locators will also decrease damages.

Andrew thanked everyone for coming, reminded them to white line and adjourned the meeting.



Update of Activities: February 2020



- 258 Cases heard since initiated in 2014.
- A memorandum of understanding in place with Deputy Attorney General for legal counsel to the UDPRB.
- \$200,000 being billed out to top 50 NC 811 transmission recipients.
- A memorandum of understanding in place with Department of Commerce for placement of funds received.
- ***Reminder: Facility Owners, Excavators and Notification Center are the ONLY parties that may be named in a complaint.***
- NC 811 providing research to all complaints received after October 1, 2019.
- To date, 77 recommendations have resulted in orders being issued by NC Utilities Commission.
- Once funding is received, next steps are to secure administration through an rfp process and to develop a dedicated UDPRB web page.
