



House Bill 872 - Law changes effective Oct. 1, 2019

Definitions

- 87-117 (1a) Board The Underground Damage Prevention Review Board
- 87-117 (18a) Parcel An extended area of land with fixed boundaries

Notification Center

- 87-120 (a) & (c) Notification Center removed from receiving, maintaining and providing general administration of reports of alleged violations.
- 87-120 (c) (9) Notification Center shall have the duties to provide information requested by the UGDPRB in consideration of reports of alleged violations.

Facility Operator

- **87-121 (a) (1)** The dimension of the pipe shall be indicated every 50 feet if the diameter or width of facility is greater than four inches.
- **87-121 (a) (1a)** The operator's identity marked in the area where the proposed excavation or demolition is to occur. At a minimum, beginning/intervals of 200 linear feet/end.



House Bill 872 - Law changes effective Oct. 1, 2019

Excavator

- 87-122 (b) (5) a. A single parcel that may exceed ¼ mile in linear length identified by a single address.
- 87-122 (b) (5) b. The lesser five adjoining parcels identified by addresses, not to exceed ¼ mile in linear length or an area not to exceed ¼ mile in linear length.
- 87-122 (c) (6) Three hour notices additional notice (allows for on-line submission)
- 87-122 (c) (10) Gas, oil, petroleum an electric transmission line has been expanded to read oil, petroleum products, or highly volatile liquid pipeline system, a gas transmission line, or an electric transmission line. No mechanized equipment within 24" of a facility unless the facility operator has consented to the use in writing and the operator's representative is on site during the use of the mechanized equipment.

Exemptions

- **87-124 (6)** An excavation or demolition performed when those responsible for routine maintenance of a right of way or any other governmental entity are performing, with labor on their permanent payroll, maintenance activities within the right-of-way.
- 87-124 (6) Drainage structures are not included in maintenance activities.
- 87-124 (6) The provisions do not apply when the excavation or demolition is performed by a contractor acting on behalf of a person or entity responsible for routine maintenance of a ROW or on behalf of any other governmental entity.



House Bill 872 - Law changes effective Oct. 1, 2019

Emergency Excavation

- 87-125 (a) Emergency excavation give notice (allows for on-line submission)
- 87-125 (c) Any person who falsely claims that an emergency exists requiring an excavation or demolition shall have violated the provisions of this Article, which shall be punishable as a Class 3 misdemeanor and may subject the violator to the imposition of penalties or other action to be taken by the Board pursuant to G.S. 87-129.

Design Notices

• 87-127 (a) (1) & (3) proposed area of excavation removed – area designated by the design notice



House Bill 872 - Law changes effective Oct. 1, 2019

Underground Damage Prevention Review Board; enforcement; civil penalties

- 87-129 (b) All reports will be submitted to the Board Notification Center removed from the process
- **87-129 (b1)** The Board shall approve training courses and the sponsors of those training courses. Any fees for training courses will be paid by the person determined to have violated this Article.
- 87-129 (e) The Board is authorized to employ contractors or other personnel as it may deem necessary to carry out the provisions of this Article.
- 87-129 (f) Board shall maintain record of reports of alleged violations for at least four years.
- 87-129 (g) On request of the Board, the Attorney General's office shall assign a legal representative to provide legal counsel.
- **87-129A** Board is authorized to impose an annual fee on operators in order to fund activities and operation of the Board in reviewing reports of alleged violations not to exceed \$200,000 annually.



Projects:

SREMC – Harnett – Forest Oaks Subdivision, Anderson Creek Subdivisions, bridge project on Elliott Bridge Rd, Pole change outs on Hwy 421, Johnston – pole change outs in Benson area.

PNG – Subdivision in Clayton on Hwy 42, running main line in Angier, Campbell University project, new main in Smithfield.

J F Wilkerson - project on Buffalo Rd in Johnston Cty, finished one on Durwood Stephenson Rd

NCDOT - Hwy 42.

Duke – I95 widening from Hwy 42 for I40, subdivisions.

Discussion:

Parrish Reddick presented the NC811 report. Overall locate tickets were up 14.9% from last year. Harnett County had a .3% increase in locates and Johnston County had a 13.6% increase. 3 hour tickets have gone up dramatically, they increased 328% this July compared to last July in Harnett County and 168.8% in Johnston County. Parrish discussed the symptoms and treatments for Heat Exhaustion and Heat Stroke. Per Parrish there are changes to House Bill 872 that go into effect on October 1, 2019. A few of the changes include how violations are reported, how often the dimensions of the pipe are marked and how 3hrs. tickets are entered. The Board will meet on October 18th at Wrightsville Beach and there will be a Mock Line Strike in Concord on October 2nd.

Butch with NCDOT mentioned that even when they call in a 3 hour ticket, they are still not receiving a positive response. Thornton's Plumbing said they are getting a lot of responses that say "locator and excavator have agreed" but they have not received any calls. Michael with J F Wilkerson said they have started billing for the administrative cost and crew and truck idle time while waiting for a response. Andrew with SREMC recommended that we contact the utility if we are not getting responses from their locate companies. Someone mentioned that some companies are screening their locate tickets but are using out of date maps.

It was also mentioned that the utilities should put a line in their contracts that states that the contractor must attend a few UCC meetings a year, this would give them valuable contacts. It would also be nice to see a representative from the locate companies and some of the other utilities at the meetings.

Andrew reminded everyone that communication is key in getting lines located and he adjourned the meeting.
