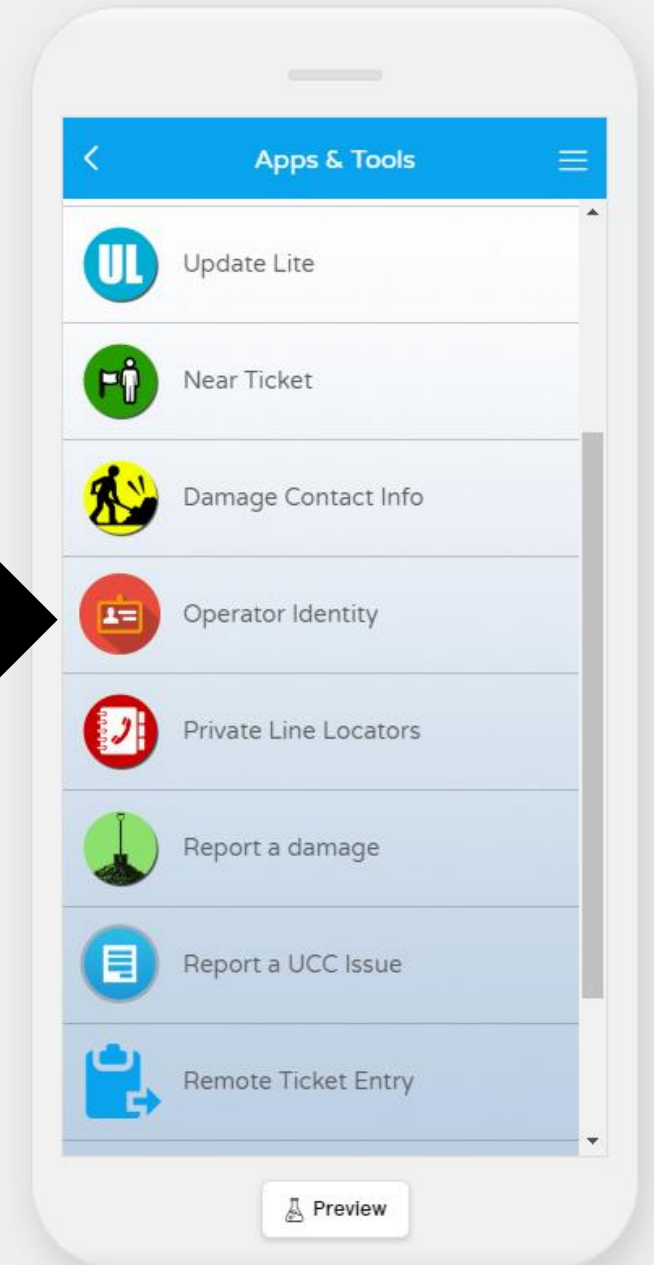

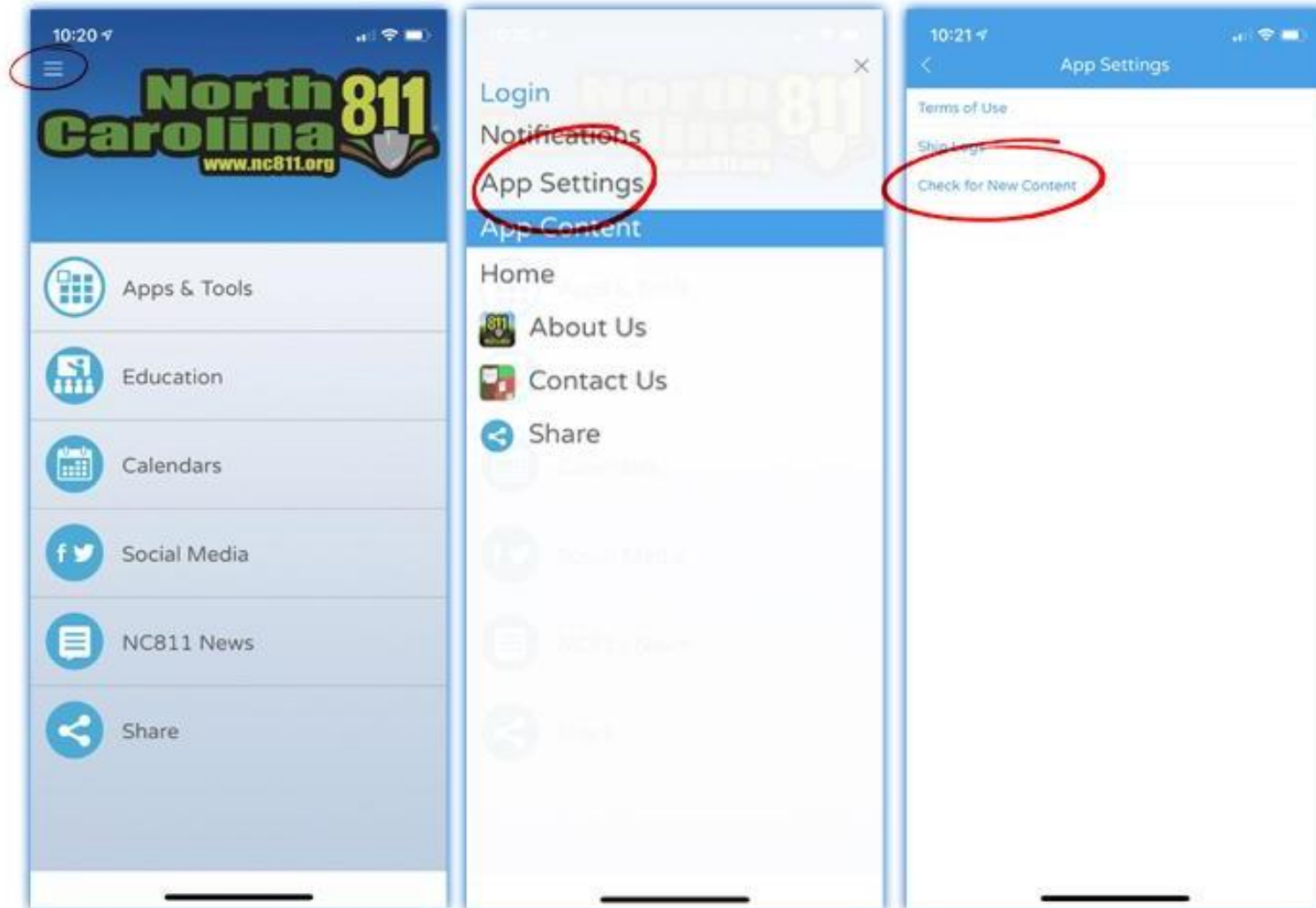

PLEASE NOTE

If the diameter or width of the facility is greater than four inches, the dimension of the facility shall be indicated at least every 50 feet in the area of the proposed excavation or demolition. An operator who operates multiple facilities in the area of the proposed excavation or demolition shall locate each facility.

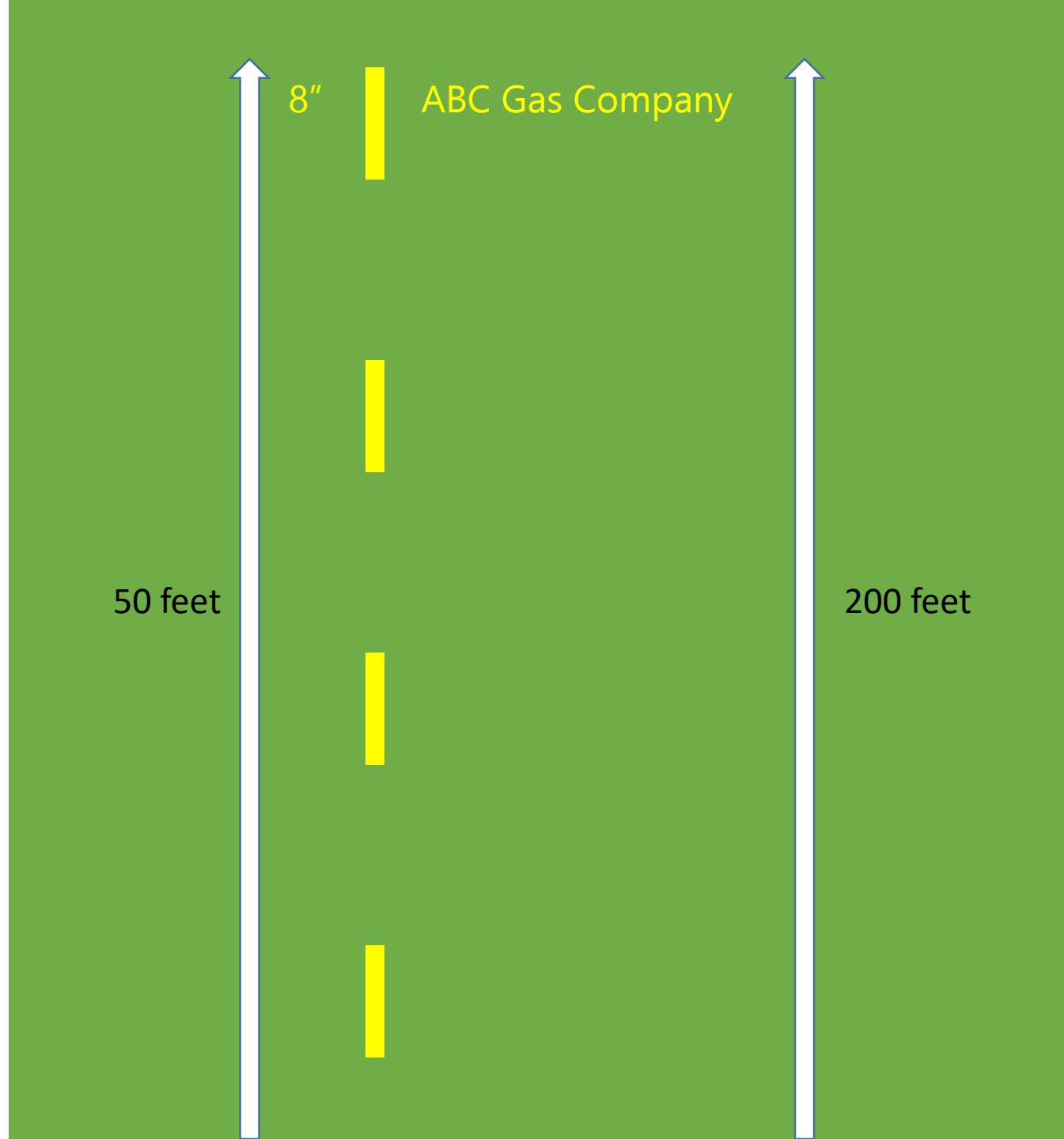
The operator's identity, marked as provided in subdivision (1) of this subsection, in the area where the proposed excavation or demolition is to occur. At a minimum, the operator's identity shall be marked at the beginning point, at intervals of 200 linear feet, and at the end point of the proposed excavation or demolition.

- Brian Morehouse went over housekeeping and emergency evacuation.

Introductions

- Brian Morehouse started introductions, and then went around the room.
- Safety Share presented by: Brian Morehouse
- Topic – New Laws are out, Get to know them!!! Help those that might be in need for the Holidays

Old Business

- Any Changes to last month's minutes? (NONE)

Officer Reports

Chair- Nothing new to report.

Co-Chair/Secretary- Please see attendance sheet attached.

New Business

- NC 811 / One Call presentation was given by: Brian Morehouse- Make sure you register for the upcoming Mock Line Strike on October 2nd 2019 at the Cabarrus Arena, Concord, NC. Seating is limited, there is NO cost to attend and lunch will be provided. Great event to attend. Don't forget to reserve your seat TODAY!! Time is running out; this is an event you don't want to miss.

Open Discussion Reports

- A. **NC 811 / One Call** – *Brian provided us with the monthly 811 update. Also Brian talked to us about 811 having 811 come to your office and do an 811 Safety Presentation. Brian Morehouse went over the October 2019 presentation giving the totals for YTD and Monthly number for Tickets called in, average locates per day and (3) hour tickets. (This is included as a PDF on the UCC website) Brian went over how to donate to the Food Banks and other organization to help those in need. Encourage all of those in attendance to help others during the Holiday season. NC811 went over some of the new laws and procedures that are now in effect as of October 1st 2019. Went over with the group how the MLS went at the Cabarrus Arena on Wednesday October 2nd 2019. Have received a lot of positive feedback from those that attend. Talked about large projects in the area and locating issues. Brian Morehouse gave everyone the supervisors numbers for locating companies that are within this area. Encouraging others to reach out to those supervisors if they are having issues with getting tickets cleared. Had an open discussion with all in attendance about how to make our local UCC better and what type of information they may be looking for now and in the future.*
- B. **N.C.D.O.T** – Bridge work continues throughout the area; it was reported that certain projects may be put on hold due to the budget. Small bridge work will continue with general maintenance and culvert repairs still on schedule. Reported to all that the state budget is on hold, some projects have been delayed due to this budget for 2019 into 2020. Road pavement is going along as scheduled and general maintenance work will continue.
- C. **Dominion Energy** – NO major damages to report in the area. General work continues as stated in the last meetings notes as described.
- D. **USIC** – NA
- E. **Town of Clyde**- Stated that they just finished up their two big projects from August and at this time have no large projects to report to the group. Was told that they are doing general maint work in the area and have no reports of damage to their system at this time. (1,000 ft on new line installed)
- F. **Town of Waynesville**- (2) new 20,000 galleon tanks are going on line by the end of 2019. Reports that they have been bust with water break mains but not reporting any major damage during the last month. Have three large projects that are under approval and hope to report more at our meeting in December 2019. Having locate issues with getting Duke located in the area. Brian Morehouse gave them the number fo the Supervisor for USIC in the area. Having issues with Duke Energy lines getting marked when it is actually the City of Waynesville, they are being mis- marked. They will be reaching out and letting USIC know about this issue. Also having a problem with LKN Underground going out and installing UG lines before they are able to locate and clear those tickets. LKN Underground did cut one if the main lines last week and upper management has notified the facility owner of these problems.
