Updates from NC 811 Education Liaison, Howard Corey Looking at the numbers...

- Statewide Ticket and Transmission Requests in NC for July was 160,565 –
 a -3.4% decrease from July 2016.
- Onslow County Ticket Volume in July 2017 was 2,218 a
 55.8 % increase over July 2016. Jones County Ticket Volume in July 2017 was 129 a 27.5% decrease from July 2016.
- For Jones County, the majority of locates were requested in the Pollocksville and Maysville areas. For Onslow County, the majority of locates were requested in the Jacksonville and Richlands areas.

Guest Speaker

Onslow County EMS *Captain Bobby Price* gave a presentation on giving first aid at the workplace. He understands that while utility workers are out working in many remote areas in the community, so many dangerous things can happen. He outlined what things to look for and the steps to take if someone on your worksite is injured.

The #1 advice is for everyone to stay hydrated during the hot summer days.

Steps to take during an emergency:

- Figure out what has happened to a fellow co-worker to injure them. Make sure the area is safe so that no one else gets hurt. SCENE SAFETY!
- Render aid to the injured person.
- Remember C, A, B...Circulation, Airway, Breathing
- Check level of consciousness; can they hear you or respond to you?
- Protect their head and neck by holding the neck steady.
- Check for any other life-threatening injuries. Just because you see bleeding cuts, or open fractures, that doesn't mean there's not an even bigger issue with the victim that could kill them.

Things to look for that could kill an injured person on site:

- Blocked airway. Remove anything from the airway causing them to not breathe.
- Rapid, very obvious, major bleeding; especially spurting blood. Find something to make a tourniquet above the site as tightly as possible to help stop the bleeding.
- Make sure they are breathing and the airway is clear.

Other ways to render aid:

- For fractured bones, splint it in the position you found the bone. Don't try to straighten it or put it back in the position it belongs. Use something hard and solid and tie it off above and below to hold the fractured area in the same place.
- For burns, remove victim away from the source of heat. Rapidly cool the area with cool water for 5 minutes. Remove the clothing from the burn site, (except if the skin has adhered to the burn site, do not try to remove that.)
- After an electrocution, perform CPR.

For staff members with allergies, make-sure they have an allergy kit or Epi-Pen on them at all times.

Other Topics of Discussion...

Chairman Ralph Murphy advised that according to the UCC By-laws, the committee would need to elect a new Chairperson for the year 2018. He suggested that we hold the election next month at the September meeting, so the new Chairperson can be ready to begin in January 2018. NC 811 Liaison Howard Corey remarked that with many UCC committees, the Chairperson remains in place for several years. He stated that it is really up to the local committee members. Ralph asked that everyone think about it, and be ready to vote on their decision next month!

LOCAL UTILITY UPDATES

Onslow Emergency Services – Fire Marshal Brian Kelley thanked Captain Bobby Price for his presentation on giving first aid in an emergency situation. He discussed the need for on-site responders and stressed learning the basic skills that could possibly save someone's life. He also stressed to supervisors that it is a MUST for outside field crews to be hydrated and the importance of making fresh cold water available for staff. He also discussed their smoke alarm program and asks for volunteers to install those smoke alarms. There is currently a waiting list of 70 needy families in need of smoke alarms; some of those people are disabled and/or elderly persons.

JOEMC – Subdivision work; changing out transmission poles on Back Swamp Rd; maintenance work in Sneads Ferry; working at Turkey Point and on Queens Creek Rd. There was 150+ at the breakfast last year. Please let the JOEMC office staff knows what your donation is for (UCC Breakfast). NCDOT – Many projects coming; be ready.

Century Link – Met with NCDOT, discussed upcoming work on Western Blvd, discussed joint use conduit systems and appreciates all of the utilities working together. Very busy time of year for all. Gary Whitehead introduced Engineering team.

J&L Cable – Loretta Maiori came to say goodbye. They're closing their in Jacksonville; they are moving to Florida.

UUPLLC – Staying busy; having trouble finding help with good work ethic.

ONWASA – Holly Ridge Sewer Improvements project starting today in Holly Ridge on Hines St and Jenkins St; project will last about 6 months. Please advise if you see someone tampering with a hydrant or taking water from a hydrant, please contact ONWASA. Staff is available 24 hours a day.

City of Jacksonville – Very busy

Piedmont Natural Gas – Still working on land acquisition; they are working on moving the city gate from Camp Lejeune to the City of Jacksonville. It will probably take until January to have the gas on and functioning there. Maintenance work on Brynn Marr Rd.


