Chairman Ralph Murphy welcomed everyone and asked that they please sign in and silence their cell phones.

NC 811 Education Liaison Howard Corey reviewed the totals from April and discussed upcoming events for May.

Looking at the numbers...

- **Jones County** total locate requests for April was **98**; **Onslow County** total locate requests for April was **1,908**.
- For **Jones County**, the majority of locates were requested in the **Pollocksville and Trenton** areas. For **Onslow County**, the majority of locates were requested in the **Jacksonville and Sneads Ferry** areas.
- In April of 2018, **686** damage events occurred across the state of NC!
- There was a **12% increase** in locate ticket requests across the state for April 2018, compared to April 2017.

****LOCAL UTILITY UPDATES****

NCDOT – Pipe replacement and various construction projects throughout the county.

Jacksonville Mechanical/Sadale Utilities/R&W – Finishing up at Bradford Estates; doing some work at Bridgeport Subdivision, and working back and forth between Camp Lejeune and Cherry Point bases.

Onslow County Emergency Services - Fire Marshal Brian Kelly – Wrapping up on Spring wildfire season. ***Brian asked everyone to keep grass and weeds cut around your company/organization's utilities.*** Brian thanked Donnie Smith for his presentation on managing heat stress and heat-related illnesses. He also spoke about the opioid crisis in our community. Brian says there are dangerous drugs that if you just breathe the dust from them, you could get sick. Be sure to keep gloves handy and use them when clearing trash and debris from around your facilities. If you come in contact with some of these drugs, it could give you an instant overdose and you would need immediate medical attention.

Charter Communications - Business as usual.

Piedmont Natural Gas – Scattered services throughout Jacksonville, working at the new Arby's on Marine Blvd, near the Onslow County courthouse, and on Camp Lejeune. The Piney Green Rd project is still to come.

Underground Utility Placement – Busy.

USIC – Busy as usual.

PLURIS – Working in Hubert at Eastport, in Sneads Ferry and Hampstead area, Stone Bay Townhomes 60 units, daycare in Sneads Ferry, about 700 homes in Pender County, Bridgeport Subdivision. Kaarin Williams with PLURIS says they are hosting a blood drive on June 16th in Sneads Ferry.

Tom Mattison Inspections – Announced an upcoming fish fry at the USO on May 23rd.

JOEMC – Very busy working on many projects; Heron Watch in Swansboro, Richlands Elementary School, Sneads Ferry and Pender County projects.

Jason Pittman – Work in Jacksonville and New Bern for SuddenLink.

Gary advised that everyone should take to heart all of the safety measures to stay healthy. Workwise – lots of work at Williamsburg Plantation, The Commons and the Reserve Apartments.

ONWASA – Working in most all subdivisions, working on projects with DOT. Staff is working on an organization-wide Hurricane preparedness/Damage assessment exercise on May 30th. Two staff members – Anthony Harris and Tyler Smith just passed their drone pilot certification test to do more damage assessment if needed.

Chairman Ralph Murphy reminded everyone that we will begin working on preparing for the October breakfast meeting. Ralph was assured by Louis Panzer, Executive Director of NC 811 that, he will be present this year!

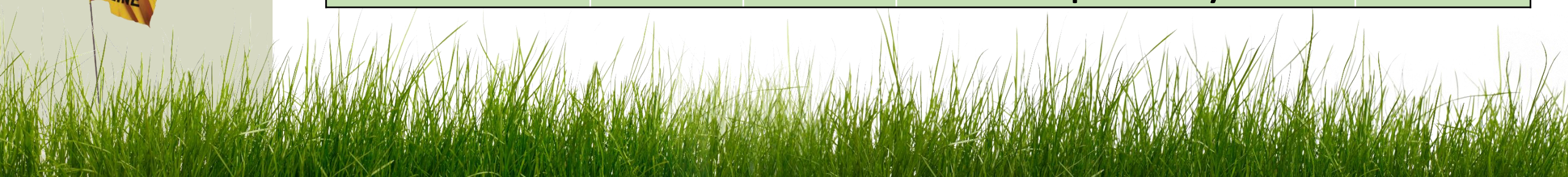

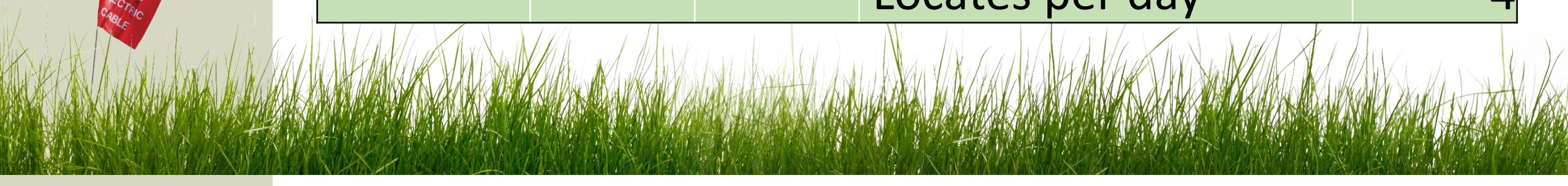

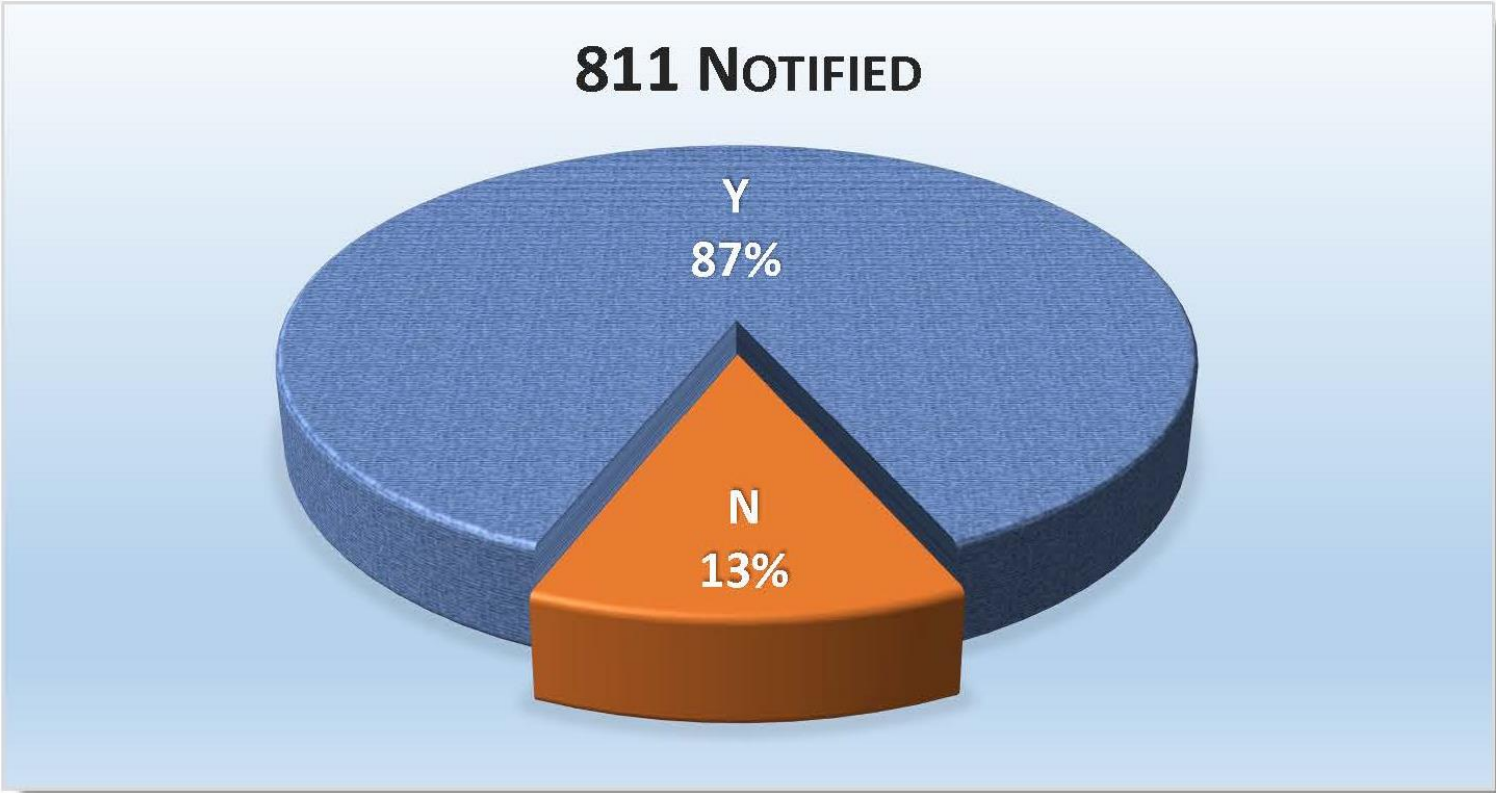

WHITE PAINT OR FLAGS ON A JOB SITE ELIMINATES GUESSWORK.

Sometimes it is difficult for excavators to relay the exact location of their dig sites to the one call center. Even clear and accurate information relayed in writing or verbally to one person may not be clear to another. With white lining, locators have excavation information on paper, and also have a clearly marked excavation area. White lining helps to avoid misinterpretation and allows for more accurate locates.
