


Safety Tips for working outdoors this summer



DRINK UP

Thirsty or not, drink plenty of water – a cup every 15 to 20 minutes. Avoid caffeine or alcohol which can dehydrate you.

ACCLIMATIZE

It takes time to adjust to working in heat. Work with your supervisor to gradually increase your work load and heat exposure.

COVER UP AND PROTECT

Wear light, loose-fitting clothing, UV rated sunglasses, and a wide-brim hat. Apply sunscreen with a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of at least 30 and UVA / UVB protection. Reapply every 2 hours and after sweating.

SHIELD FROM SUN

Set up shade structures or use umbrellas, buildings, or trees to shield you from the rays of the sun. You can get sunburn on a cloudy day.



Safety Tips for working outdoors this summer



TIME IT RIGHT

Try and avoid the sun and strenuous tasks between 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. when the sun's rays are strongest.

COOL OFF

Take breaks to rest and cool off in the shade or in air-conditioned buildings or vehicles. Don't over-exert yourself.

Lee County Utility Coordinating Meeting

PSNC Energy, 800 N. Horner Blvd., Sanford, NC

Meeting Time: The meeting was called to order by Kevin Smith at 8:35 am and introductions were made. After introductions were made, chairman, Michael Lamping arrived and formerly started the meeting, utilizing his gavel.

Total Members Present: There were a total of fourteen members.

Mike Lamping asked again (asked the previous meeting) if anyone would like to volunteer for the secretary position for this UCC and no one volunteered. Kevin Smith then asked for a volunteer for this important position and no one responded.

New Business and Projects:

Kevin Smith had researched local news and discussed an article that was found concerning Highway forty-two. Contractors and the town of Sanford are currently working to relocate several hundred graves near highway forty-two.

Kevin Reddinger with NCDOT stated water lines are being relocated near Nash Street in Sanford. Bridge replacement at the town line of Lee and Chatham County.

James Whittaker with Windstream stated there are new installations on Copper Ridge and East Providence. Windstream is in the process of installing fiber for several new housing subdivisions throughout Lee County.

Michael Lamping stated that there is a new industrial park underway near Colon Road and Interchange drive in Sanford. There is a new apartment complex being built constructed on Hawkins Avenue in Sanford.

Ryan Zakany with Branz Safety gave a quick overview of what their company provides for contractors and how they assist with safe lane closures, utilizing proper signs, flagging and overall workplace safety. He reviewed that in the year 2015 there were ninety-six thousand crashes in work zones throughout United States. In 2017, there were fifty-eight hundred NCDOT related crashes.

Kevin Smith with NC811 gave the presentation, with a strong emphasis of the meeting on the importance of safety both in excavating and keeping hydrated in the long hot summer work season. Meeting concluded shortly after the NC811 presentation.
