Meeting Topics

National Safety Month - this year's theme is "No one gets hurt"

White Lining – Best Practice Statement states when the excavation site cannot be clearly and adequately identified on the locate ticket, the excavator designates the route and/or area to be excavated using white pre-marking prior to the arrival of the locator.

- 1. Any locate issues we can help each other with:
 - Called in one lot and the cable drop is spread over multiple lots. Need to call in separate locate tickets for each lot. This will cover the excavator if there is a damage.
 - Called in a locate stating to mark the entire property and area that is white line. Note: The description of the work area overrides the white lining area (if the ticket lists both)
 - Called in for the whole job and update the tickets as the job progresses down the road. Need to call in locate ticket of the areas that will be worked on and not the entire job at one time
 - Excavator call in long locates and work area is minimal.

- 2. Are there any safety issues or concerns we need to discuss about our utilities:
 - Gas pipelines installed in the 1980's used orange colored plastic pipe. Those pipelines are still active today in the town of Wilmington
 - Roots have been known to erode the outer lining of the water pipe. BCPUA noticed a gas main is touching the water main and will address that concern with PNG
- 3. Any locate issues we can help each other with:
 - Gas facilities are using a support clamps at the locations of their "squeeze off". This helps reshape the pipe to the preferred roundness and support the "weak link" of the plastic pipeline
 - 3M Dynatel Locate Tape marker balls embedded in the warning tape cost is \$1 more per foot Billy Brown is the contact person for product
- 4. Any new / large projects starting up or updates on existing project:
 - Hwy 211 in Southport meeting with DOT this Thursday to discuss project with all affected utilities / plan is to start construction in mid-July 2018

PRG has a contract with Duke Energy to start working all their damaged claims. Within the next few months, PRG will have a contract with Piedmont Natural Gas to work on all their damaged claims.

Charter uses PRG for their damaged claims and PRG have employees that are designated for Charter. They will not work on Duke or PNG due to conflict of interests. PRG works 24/7 on damages. Charter wants to gather information about issues with locates so they can take it back and educate their personnel. Fiber splice becomes very expensive to repair.



DRINK UP

Thirsty or not, drink plenty of water – a cup every 15 to 20 minutes. Avoid caffeine or alcohol which can dehydrate you.

ACCLIMATIZE

It takes time to adjust to working in heat. Work with your supervisor to gradually increase your work load and heat exposure.

COVER UP AND PROTECT

Wear light, loose-fitting clothing, UV rated sunglasses, and a wide-brim hat. Apply sunscreen with a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of at least 30 and UVA / UVB protection. Reapply every 2 hours and after sweating.

SHIELD FROM SUN

Set up shade structures or use umbrellas, buildings, or trees to shield you from the rays of the sun. You can get sunburn on a cloudy day.



Safety Tips for working outdoors this summer



TIME IT RIGHT

Try and avoid the sun and strenuous tasks between 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. when the sun's rays are strongest.

COOL OFF

Take breaks to rest and cool off in the shade or in air-conditioned buildings or vehicles. Don't over-exert yourself.






