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Mecklenburg County UCC
August 2017

Meeting opened by Chair, Roger Richards at 10:02 am.

Safety instructions given by Sam Gonzalez; exits, restrooms, storm safety.

Introductions were made around room.

NC811 presentation given by Tami Stout.

CDOT-MCI/Verizon-1300 miles build is coming up in Charlotte.

Google-Still building. Using some new techniques-micro trenching. Working well. Running into issue with utilities being shallow. Had 4 utility strikes recently. One gas line was 4" deep. Three water service laterals 5" or less.

They are also finding other utilities utilizing their conduits. They are bringing it up to the facility owners. It is trespassing. Do not use someone else's conduit. They will remove what is in there. Their vaults are stamped GFBR. Vaults are being penetrated.

Charlotte Water- Seeing less main hits. Mostly services-some sewer laterals. Older laterals w/no tracer wires are getting hits.

Charter-Nothing to report. Busy.

Broadlinx-Nothing to report. Busy.

State Utility Contractors-66 tickets in July. Four damages, not their responsibility. 2-3 hour tickets and 4-retransmits. Tough to pothole in Union County because of the shale rock. Must be diligent for safety.

USIC- Many new builds that needs tickets. Just for example-a plumber says, "I don't have time to call in at ticket." Tickets have to be called in for safety.

AnSCO-Nothing to report. Busy.

AT&T- July was a bad month for damages. 29 copper cuts, 23 fiber cuts. Had one conduit cut at South Park Mall.

Duke- The new pilot program is going great. This is for gas dig ins (by their contractor) that caused damage. Duke will have everyone involved on site w/in 2 hours. Brings all parties together. The Duke investigator goes thru all the data to determine fault. As of July 24th damages on this type of project is down **80%**. The pilot program will continue for another month. They are doing it in Wake as well. It's a win for Duke! It is currently a Duke on Duke program, not outside entities.

Spirit- Doing great. Moving along. Building as permitted thru the Charlotte area. Utilis daily crew template is going out to those who need it.

PNG- Still improving in reduction of damages. 48 damages in July down from June. PNG did a refresher course with USIC about locates. Had some at fault damages. Cleaning up the unlocateable process.

Town of Matthews- Business as usual.

Badger- A LOT of work. Staying busy.

Sanders- BUSY!

Discussion about marking standards and how duct banks are marked; how different entities mark.

Discussion about abandoned lines. Contractors run into a lot of abandoned lines-nonproductive for excavator. They do due diligence then run into a line that was not marked; if it is abandoned, can take a while to determine so the crews are sitting on the job site. Need a better way to delineate abandoned lines; facility owners need a way to show lines have been abandoned.

Next meeting-September 27th, hosted by the Town of Matthews, 232 Matthews Station Street.
