The meeting began with a safety moment about staying on guard for differences in company vs personal vehicles – particularly when the 'cabs' of the vehicles are the same: A 39-year accident-free supervisor was leaving late for home from a pull-through parking spot he'd properly parked in. He called his spouse to say when he expected to be home and – between being in the identical-looking cab as his personal vehicle and having a normal "home" conversation – moved his mental model from "work" truck (long wheel base) to "life" truck (short wheel base) and scraped his rear quarter across the nose of the car next to him on exit. It can happen to any of us.

Approval of the minutes from the January 31, 2019 meeting were deferred to Howard Corey for approval due to full changeover of attendees from that meeting to this. A highlight of the prior meeting was the hold-harmless language of NC Damage Prevention law in cases where facility owners elect to not become 811 members. Paraphrasing: **Non-members can** *not* hold excavators liable for damages incurred when excavators **follow the process** and **dig with care**.

Howard Corey provided case-study information on a multi-fatality tragedy resulting from a ground rod driven through a gas line (no 811 call; no marks). The first responder for the gas company was among those killed in the subsequent house explosion. In another instance, an individual who'd cut a gas line misguidedly laid plywood across the excavation/leak thinking it would help – with similarly disastrous results.

Mr. Corey reviewed recent ticket volume, emphasizing the goal for quality vs quantity -- 'good' tickets (not 6 months' worth of every-12-days updates).

811 App discussions included the "Education" section (the Excavators' Guide in particular) and the "Near Ticket" button (still a fan favorite). ALSO: facility owners can link directly to nc811 from our own websites with a Share811 link (more info @: www.nc811.org/share-nc811.html).


