


# Safety Tips for working outdoors this summer



#### **DRINK UP**

Thirsty or not, drink plenty of water – a cup every 15 to 20 minutes. Avoid caffeine or alcohol which can dehydrate you.

#### **ACCLIMATIZE**

It takes time to adjust to working in heat. Work with your supervisor to gradually increase your work load and heat exposure.



# Safety Tips for working outdoors this summer



#### **COVER UP AND PROTECT**

Wear light, loose-fitting clothing, UV rated sunglasses, and a wide-brim hat. Apply sunscreen with a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of at least 30 and UVA / UVB protection. Reapply every 2 hours and after sweating.

# **SHIELD FROM SUN**

Set up shade structures or use umbrellas, buildings, or trees to shield you from the rays of the sun. You can get sunburn on a cloudy day.



# Safety Tips for working outdoors this summer



#### **TIME IT RIGHT**

Try and avoid the sun and strenuous tasks between 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. when the sun's rays are strongest.

#### **COOL OFF**

Take breaks to rest and cool off in the shade or in air-conditioned buildings or vehicles. Don't over-exert yourself.

#### Randolph County Utility Coordinating Meeting Randolph Electric Membership Corp. 879 McDowell Rd. Asheboro, NC 27205

Meeting Time: The meeting was called to order by Kevin Smith at 1:38 pm. Introductions were made and meeting moved to recent damages. Meeting was delayed with the anticipation of additional members arriving.

Total Members Present: There were six members. Chairperson Shad Brady was absent. Secretary, Judy Adams had sent Kevin Smith an email, stating that she would be unable to attend this meeting.

#### **Recent Damages:**

Daniel Semler with Heath Consultants advised the group of two recent damages. Daniel stated there was a gas main that was damaged by the town of Asheboro. Damage was caused during an excavation while utilizing a mini excavator and town employees were working on an expired ticket. He also stated that the DOT damaged a gas line with a mini excavator on Draper Road in Asheboro.

#### **New Business and Projects:**

Lee Parris with NCDOT stated there are a couple of bridge replacements currently underway in Randolph County.

Rob Sledge with Southeast Connections stated they are in the process of installing forty-thousand feet of eight inch pipe in Randolph County.

#### **General Discussion:**

Barry Sensing with Southeast Connections stated the importance of white lining by contractors and helps greatly with getting accurate locate marks.

Kevin Smith asked if anyone has seen D.J. with the town of Archdale and no one had. Kevin also asked if anyone has spoken or seen the current chair for this UCC, Shad Brady. Kevin stated he has called and sent emails and has not heard back from him. Kevin mentioned that this UCC needs to move forward and elect a new Chairperson.

Kevin Smith with NC811 gave the presentation, with a strong emphasis of the meeting on working safely and the importance of staying hydrated in working in the hot summer months. Meeting concluded shortly after the general discussion.
