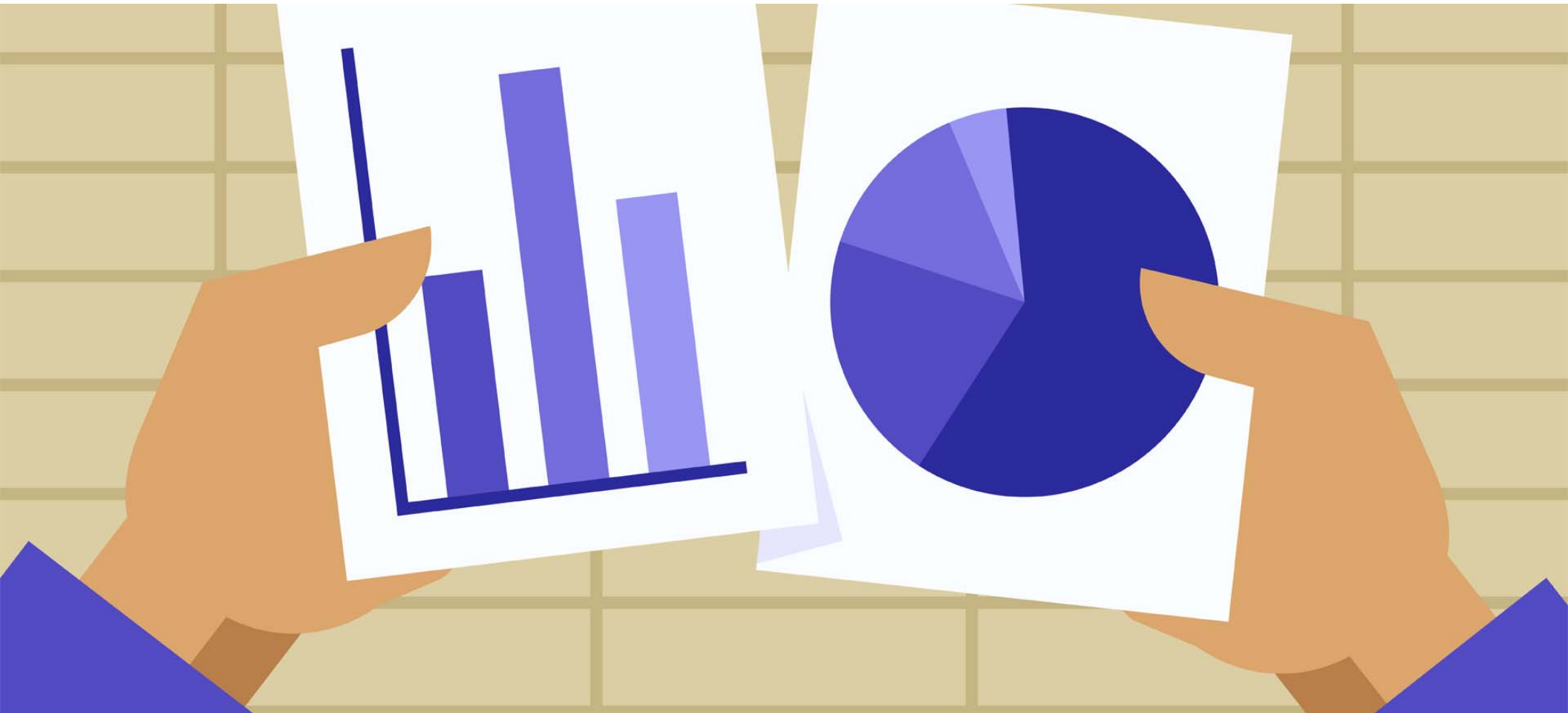

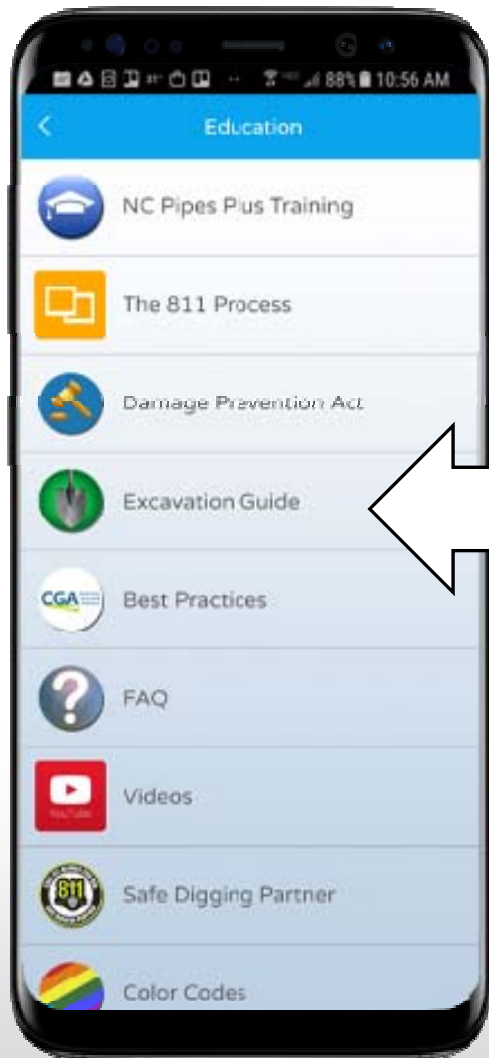

Meeting Time: The meeting was called to order by Judy Adams at 12:05 p.m. Judy, conducted a level one safety check with all attendees and various emergency procedures were discussed.

Total Members Present: There were Thirteen members.

Recent Damages: There were no significant damages that this group were aware, within Randolph County, since our last meeting.

New Business and Projects:

Scott Faulkner, with Duke Energy, stated they are in process of assisting in the renovation project for Randolph High School. Scope of the work involves converting overhead electric lines to underground. Jamie Yow, with the NCDOT, stated they are working on replacing two bridges in Randolph county.

NC811 Presentation:

Kevin Smith gave the NC811 presentation and gave considerable time on the importance of contractors not updating a ticket until the twelfth day, having the locate request accurate in the description of the address, if white lining, do not include, locate entire property, and not to call in locates for area's which will not be worked immediately upon locates. Kevin also reviewed the NC811 app and went over key features of this app. He stressed the importance of having the "App" as one of the most important tools all utility personnel could have.

Kevin also asked contractors / companies not to request locate tickets for which the actual work will take place immediately. Several companies call / request locate tickets for projects that are months down the road.

General Discussion:

Conversation turned to the code "60" and a lengthy discussion was held. Mike Pratt, with USIC, stated the code "60" automatically sends a message to the person / company whom requested the locate ticket. He went on to say that they message is sent, prior to his employees having the opportunity to contact the person / company whom sent the request. Code 60 states, "Locator and excavator agreed and documented marking schedule.

Mike went on to say that the tickets are coming in so fast, it's impossible to keep up with them. He then gave an example of a contractor whom is working with him and communicating with consistently, letting him know where they will be working that week, etc. This is a great example of a contractors and locators working together.
