

Meeting Minutes

July 12th, 2016 at 10:00AM Piedmont Natural Gas 1921 8th Avenue NW Hickory, NC

Called to Order & Welcomed Guest

- o Donna Zuniga called the meeting to order at 10:07 AM.
- Richard Lawrence of Piedmont Natural Gas went over housekeeping, and emergency evacuations.
- Approval of agenda for July meeting: a motion was made to accept by Tim Yarbro, and was seconded by Tom West, and all approved. (It was noted that the previous minutes should have stated March, instead of January, and also that 811 needed to be moved to the top of the agenda.)
- The safety share was presented by Donna Zuniga. She shared an OSHA fact sheet concerning heat stress, ticks, mosquitos, poison oak, poison ivy, as well as other warm weather related issues that could cause bodily harm.

- NC811/One Call Marc Schuman provided 811 updates, as well as a link to, "How do you 811?" contest, and encouraged all to take part. Marc also announced the 811 board meeting would be October 21st, 2016, at Harrahs' Cherokee Casino at 8:30 am.

- Electric/Power Companies Donna Zuniga of Duke Energy announced that they
 held a meeting with management about the merger, with Piedmont Natural Gas, (with
 a possibility of the merger being completed by the end of 2016.) Also she commented
 on the status of damages in Wake County, as Google, and AT&T have made things
 difficult.

- Excavators/Contractors Tim Yarbro of Ansco said that North Carolina is very busy for us, (Ansco), as they are actively working in Raleigh, as well as Wake, and Mecklenburg Counties. They are also actively working on locates with USIC.

- Locator/Locate Companies Chris Russ of USIC commented on the amount of ticket increase, (up 27% higher this year.) He encouraged everyone to be attentive looking out for traffic, as well as the safety of all locators. Also he encouraged everyone while calling in locate tickets to give as much information as possible as it will help out those doing the locates.
- Gas Companies and Gas Pipelines Teresa VonCannon of Piedmont Natural Gas made known that the merger with Duke Energy is going well. She also added that damages are on the rise, and anything that anyone could possibly do to help with damage prevention would be a huge asset to all Utilities.
- Oil & Oil Pipelines Tom West of Colonial Pipeline said they would have a lot of digs going on across the state in areas such as Rockingham, Greensboro, and Wake County. Anyone is more than welcome to contact Tom with any issues, or to receive help concerning Colonial Pipeline.

- Public Works Representative of the City of Hickory complained of contractors
 continually calling in locates, and they are constantly never being done. Tim Yarbro of
 Ansco responded to the complaint that it should be addressed at the local UCC. Tom
 West of Colonial Pipeline added that the topic has been discussed at local UCCs, and
 that the underlying factor is issues with planning. Billy Rice of PSNC added that
 anyone is welcome to file complaints with the review board, as written complaints are

being accepted as of now, and also that unfortunately a lot of the problems currently with planning for work to be done has a lot to do with the frequent changes in weather.
