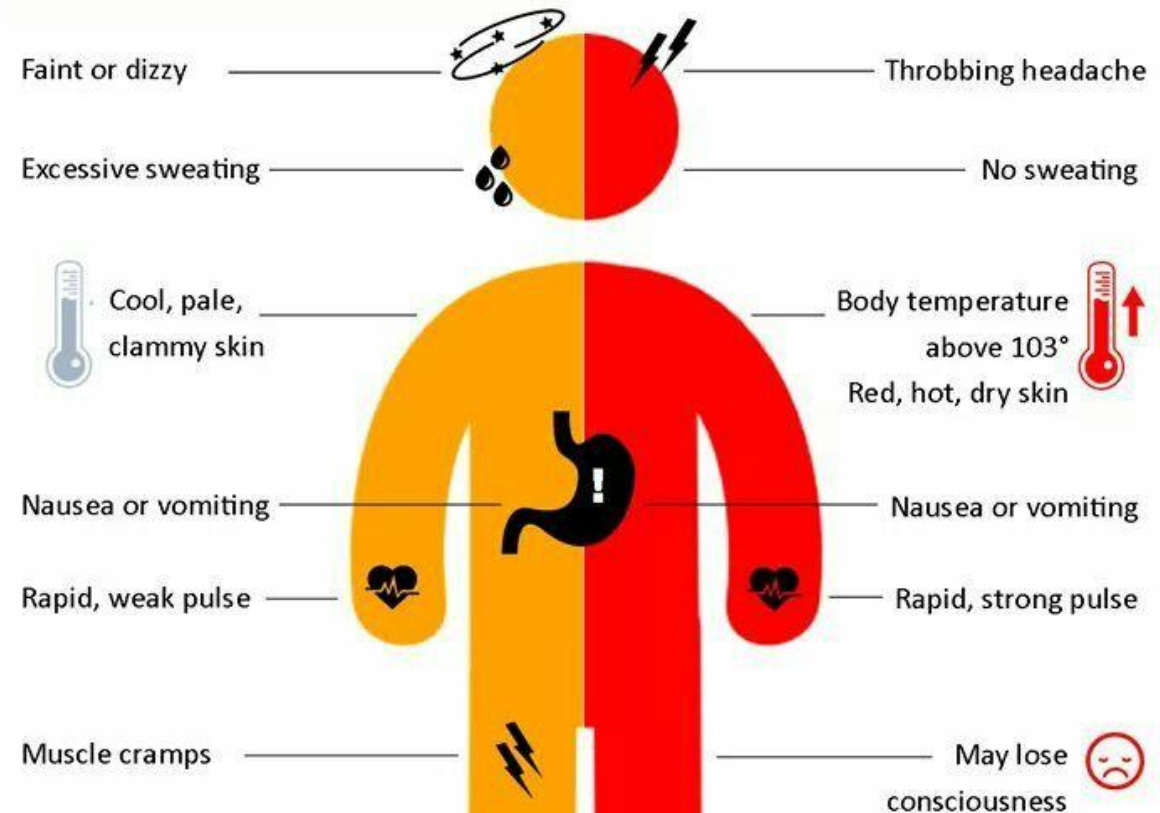

NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

House Bill 872 - Law changes effective Oct. 1, 2019

Definitions

- **87-117 (1a)** Board – The Underground Damage Prevention Review Board
- **87-117 (18a)** Parcel – An extended area of land with fixed boundaries

Notification Center

- **87-120 (a) & (c)** Notification Center removed from receiving, maintaining and providing general administration of reports of alleged violations.
- **87-120 (c) (9)** Notification Center shall have the duties to provide information requested by the UGDPRB in consideration of reports of alleged violations.

Facility Operator

- **87-121 (a) (1)** The dimension of the pipe shall be indicated every 50 feet if the diameter or width of facility is greater than four inches.
- **87-121 (a) (1a)** The operator's identity marked in the area where the proposed excavation or demolition is to occur. At a minimum, beginning/intervals of 200 linear feet/end.



NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

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Excavator

- **87-122 (b) (5) a.** A single parcel that may exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ mile in linear length identified by a single address.
- **87-122 (b) (5) b.** The lesser five adjoining parcels identified by addresses, not to exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ mile in linear length or an area not to exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ mile in linear length.
- **87-122 (c) (6)** Three hour notices – additional notice (allows for on-line submission)
- **87-122 (c) (10)** Gas, oil, petroleum an electric transmission line has been expanded to read oil, petroleum products, or highly volatile liquid pipeline system, a gas transmission line, or an electric transmission line. No mechanized equipment within 24" of a facility unless the facility operator has consented to the use in writing and the operator's representative is on site during the use of the mechanized equipment.

Exemptions

- **87-124 (6)** An excavation or demolition performed when those responsible for routine maintenance of a right of way or any other governmental entity are performing, with labor on their permanent payroll, maintenance activities within the right-of-way.
- **87-124 (6)** Drainage structures are not included in maintenance activities.
- **87-124 (6)** The provisions do not apply when the excavation or demolition is performed by a contractor acting on behalf of a person or entity responsible for routine maintenance of a ROW or on behalf of any other governmental entity.



NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

House Bill 872 - Law changes effective Oct. 1, 2019

Emergency Excavation

- **87-125 (a)** Emergency excavation – give notice (allows for on-line submission)
- **87-125 (c)** Any person who falsely claims that an emergency exists requiring an excavation or demolition shall have violated the provisions of this Article, which shall be punishable as a Class 3 misdemeanor and may subject the violator to the imposition of penalties or other action to be taken by the Board pursuant to G.S. 87-129.

Design Notices

- **87-127 (a) (1) & (3)** proposed area of excavation removed – area designated by the design notice



NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

House Bill 872 - Law changes effective Oct. 1, 2019

Underground Damage Prevention Review Board; enforcement; civil penalties

- **87-129 (b)** All reports will be submitted to the Board – Notification Center removed from the process
- **87-129 (b1)** The Board shall approve training courses and the sponsors of those training courses. Any fees for training courses will be paid by the person determined to have violated this Article.
- **87-129 (e)** The Board is authorized to employ contractors or other personnel as it may deem necessary to carry out the provisions of this Article.
- **87-129 (f)** Board shall maintain record of reports of alleged violations for at least four years.
- **87-129 (g)** On request of the Board, the Attorney General's office shall assign a legal representative to provide legal counsel.
- **87-129A** Board is authorized to impose an annual fee on operators in order to fund activities and operation of the Board in reviewing reports of alleged violations not to exceed \$200,000 annually.

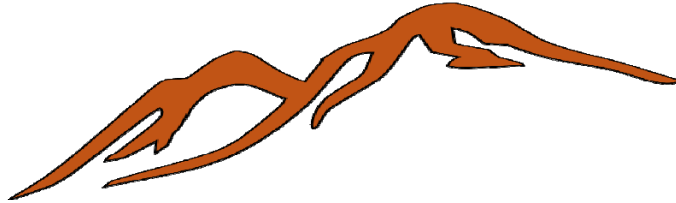

- NC 811 / One Call presentation was given by: Brian Morehouse presented the August 2019 UCC Program. Went over the number for the YTD and Monthly Stats showing an increase in tickets over all in the system being up. Brian spoke to the group about heat exhaustion and heat stroke, know the difference and how to handle the situation if it occurs.
- NC811 presented to the group the new laws that will take effect as of October 1st 2019. Answered questions from the group.
- Went over upcoming events to beware of and the location for each.
- Brian Morehouse asked the group for feedback on how their projects were being located and get ideas of how they are being handled.
- The group was reminded of the MLS that will be on October 2nd at Cabarrus Arena, all were reminded to sign up on the website

Open Discussion

- Group spoke about the issues of getting projects located, how it is costing them money due to locates not being marked on time.

Reports

- A. **NC 811 / One Call** – Brian provided us with the monthly 811 update. Also Brian talked to us about 811 having a successful safe digging month (April.) 811 has noticed a major increase in tickets this year.
- B. **N.C.D.O.T** – Major road work continues within the area, with bridgework and shoulder work being the big part of the work in the area
- C. **USIC** – N/A. Reported that they are short handed in the area at this time.
- D. **Duke Energy** – Throughout the area in Wilkes and Surry, OH crews are sill reconducting 3 phase lines. No subdivision work going on at this time. They have had a lot of OH pole builds getting to new home sites as need,
- E. **Spectrum** – Work load is heavy with services being run in the area. They have reported a few issues with locates being marked for Duke. They have a some cut services in the area where the lines were located.
- F. **Riverstreet-** **No major lines being installed but their new service work is very heavy at this time. As for locate issues, they are having to call in (3) hour notices on a regular basis. They have mentioned that it is very hard to get CenturyLink out to mark their lines and to updates the tickets when called in.**
- G. **Surry-Yadkin EMC-** **3 phase over work being done on Holley Springs and High Street. As for UG service work, that have had a very busy month of July and don't see it slowing down. Issues with locates. Over the last (2) weeks they have had to call in (20) three hour tickets.**
- H. **Yadkin Valley Sewage-** **Work load is steady, no big projects to report of. Have had around 3 or 4 emergency repairs to make since the last meeting. Have seen a number of locates being off and locates not getting done on time and it was stated that it seems there are more (3) hour ticktes being called in , because they are not getting out there on time and others are saying how that is holding them up to complete projects.**
- I. **SatDirect-** **Not attended. Brian Morehouse reached out to Tim Patrick, Supervisor and invited him to this meeting,**
