# Safety Tips for working outdoors this summer



## **DRINK UP**

Thirsty or not, drink plenty of water – a cup every 15 to 20 minutes. Avoid caffeine or alcohol which can dehydrate you.

## **ACCLIMATIZE**

It takes time to adjust to working in heat. Work with your supervisor to gradually increase your workload and heat exposure.



# Safety Tips for working outdoors this summer



## COVER UP AND PROTECT

Wear light, loose-fitting clothing, UV rated sunglasses, and a wide-brim hat. Apply sunscreen with a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of at least 30 and UVA / UVB protection. Re-apply every 2 hours and after sweating.

## SHIELD FROM SUN

Set up shade structures or use umbrellas, buildings, or trees to shield you from the rays of the sun. You can get sunburn on a cloudy day.



# Safety Tips for working outdoors this summer



## TIME IT RIGHT

Try and avoid the sun and strenuous tasks between 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. when the sun's rays are strongest.

## COOL OFF

Take breaks to rest and cool off in the shade or in air-conditioned buildings or vehicles. Don't over-exert yourself.

# HEAT STROKE

## Symptoms

- Faint or Dizzy
- Headache
- Profuse Sweating
- Irritability
- Weak, Rapid Pulse
- Shallow Breathing
- Pale, Cool, Clammy Skin
- Nausea or Vomiting
- Muscle Cramps

## Treatment

- 1) Have victim lie down in a cool shaded area or air conditioned area.
- 2) Drink water if victim is conscious.
- 3) Use caution when victim stands up, apply cold compresses.

## Symptoms

- Absence of Sweating
- Pulsating Headache
- Hot, Red, Dry Skin
- High Body Temp: Above 103
- Nausea or Vomiting
- Strong, Rapid Pulse
- Confusion
- Convulsions
- May Lose Consciousness

## Treatment

### 1) DIAL 911

- 2) Take action to cool victim by any means. Place victims in a cool area, wrap in wet towel, sponge victim with cool water.
