

- Damage Reporting: Remember that if you damage an underground utility, it is **your** responsibility to report this damage to NC 811 UCC. Offices in Greensboro.
- Below is the website where you can go to communicate "Damage Violations."

- Remember! If you hit an underground objective, and you think it is a Gas Line, do the following in this order:
 - Call 911 to report the accident!
 - o Call the Gas Company and let them know the specifics concerning the damage!
 - Call 811 to report the accident to our office!
- <u>Damage Reporting:</u> It is <u>YOUR</u> responsibility to report ALL damages to underground utilities. The reports must be reported to the NC 811UCC offices in Greensboro.

Round-table Discussions:

Brian Morehouse – NC 811 Comments:

• Current in the in the Western part of the state, Spectrum is installing approximately 2, 900 miles of fiber optic cable both in-ground and above ground on poles.

- There are a lot of tele communication cables being installed all over the state of North Carolina.
- If you do not already have the NC811 app installed on your mobile device, get it, it is a helpful tool to use in your daily jobs.

• If you have damaged made to your systems, be sure and file a COMPLAINT. File the complaint against the parent company not the locator service provider. Remember, to take several photographs from various angles to be submitted with you written claim.

<u>David Perkins – Brentwood Water:</u> Nothing major going on. Install installing a few new taps, and still have a few water line leaks. We are getting ready to begin a new water line replacement project. This consists of 3,000 feet of new 6" line replacing an old outdated 2" line.

Will Dennis – Town of Rhodhiss: All is good, nothing to report.

<u>Jim Buckner – REMC:</u> Still in the pole replacement project. We have replaced several hundred poles within the system. The installation of transmission lines project is completed. Experiencing a lot of broken poles from accidents. Many of these accidents involve Mobile Home movers who do not check the height of the lines in relation to the height of the roofs on the mobile home's sections.

<u>John Leger – Town of Rutherford College:</u> Currently replacing some water lines and make repairs to leaks within their system.

<u>Chris Banietti – Badger Transportations</u>: Badger has recently changed their corporate name from "Badger Daylighting" to "Badger Transportations".

<u>Clayton Austin – Miller Pipeline</u>: Join the group today. They are a major installer of piping for Duke Energies (Piedmont Natural Gas). They have just signed a major five-year contract with PNG. They are currently working in the western North Carolina area.

Mike Sheffield – PRG Consulting: Nothing to report.
