


**Jones - Onslow

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The stages of heat illness

Hyperthermia, or overheating of the body, can be mild and temporary, but in advanced stages, it can be life-threatening. The degrees of severity:

	Skin	Pulse	Body temperature
Heat stress Occurs when hot weather puts strain on the body	 <p>Normal sweating</p>	 <p>Normal</p>	 <p>Normal</p>
Heat fatigue Feeling of weakness caused by high temperature	 <p>Cool, moist</p>	 <p>Weakened</p>	 <p>Normal</p>
Heat syncope <i>"SIN-co-pee"</i> Sudden dizziness after exercising in the heat	 <p>Pale, sweaty; feels moist, cool</p>	 <p>Usually rapid; may be weak</p>	 <p>Normal</p>
Heat cramps Painful spasms of abdomen, arm or leg muscles following exertion	 <p>Usually moist, cool</p>	 <p>Normal or rapid</p>	 <p>In normal range</p>
<p><i>Low sodium level may cause cramps, but don't take extra salt without a doctor's advice</i></p>			
Heat exhaustion Symptoms warning that body is overheating Person may be thirsty, giddy, weak, uncoordinated, nauseated or sweat copiously	 <p>Cold and clammy</p>	 <p>Normal or rapid</p>	 <p>Usually normal</p>
<p><i>Often caused by dehydration or sodium depletion, but don't take salt supplements without medical advice</i></p>			
Heat stroke A life-threatening emergency; person needs immediate medical care; death rate is high after symptoms appear	 <p>Dry and red</p>	 <p>Strong and fast</p>	 <p>Above 104 F (40 C)</p>
<p><i>Perspiration stops; person may faint or stagger, become confused or combative; coma begins if person is not assisted</i></p>

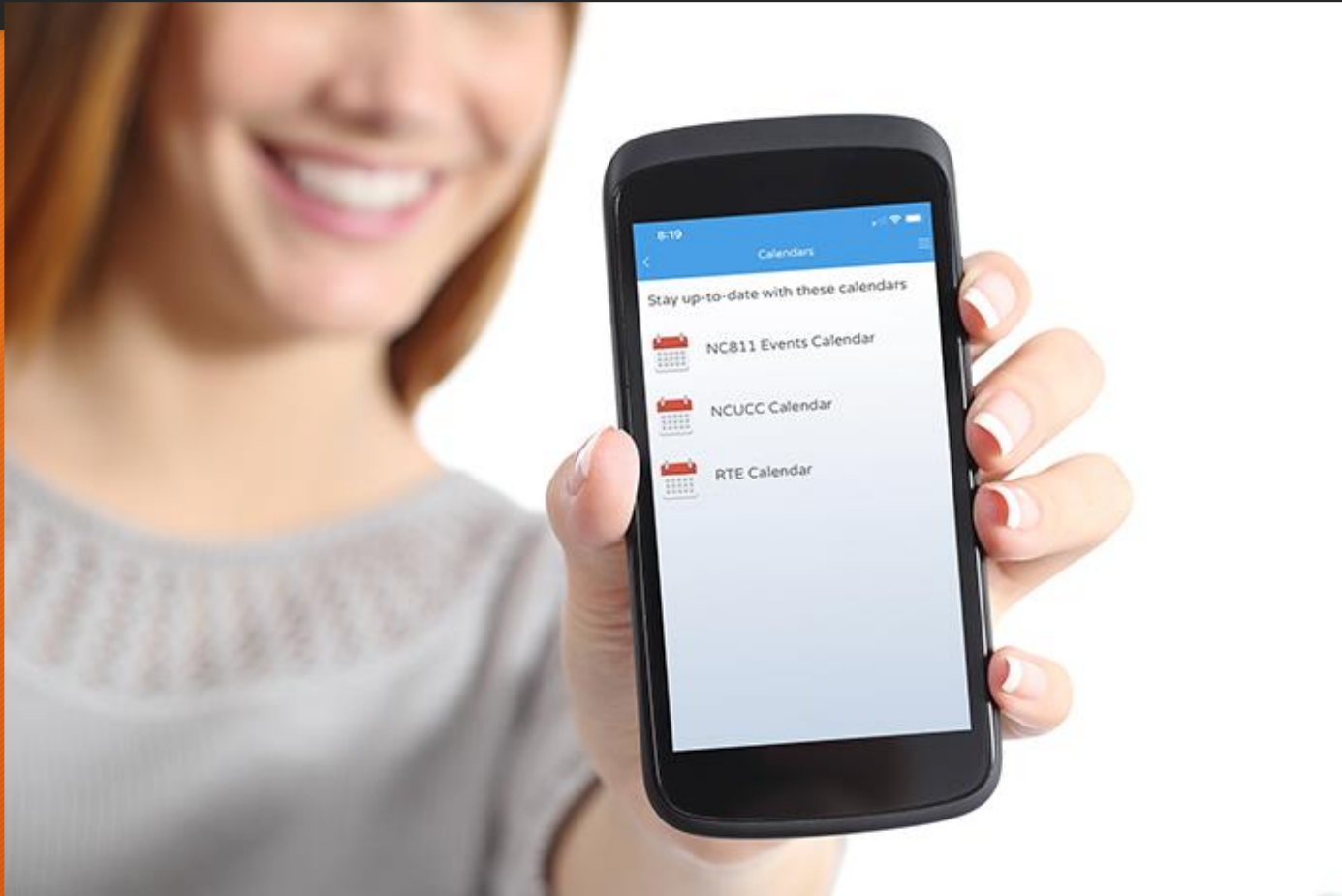

Chairman Murphy reviewed a Facebook post where someone accused MetroNet of boring into their sewer line. He warned everyone to be aware of people blaming damages on companies erroneously.

Ralph spoke about the Joint SC/NC Annual UCC Conference held in Greenville, SC. He shared pictures and talked about the locator training, guest speakers, and vendors at the conference.

Member Updates:

ONWASA – Wynne Ray discussed upcoming development projects. She said she is seeing many large subdivisions and RV parks coming in.

Piedmont Natural Gas – Bobby says they are working in Holly Ridge at J&J Superfoods, Gum Branch Rd at Drummer Kellum Rd, MARSOC at Hwy 210, Hwy 53 at Onslow Pines Rd, and on Hwy 258 at Pony Farm Rd; very busy with scattered services on Camp Lejeune and all over the county.

PRG – Dominic is working with Charter and MetroNet, handling damages and relocation projects.

KCI – Kate Powers is working on damage prevention.

Jacksonville Fire Dept – Brian Kelly says they have a lot of projects going on. He says they had a busier than normal spring wildfire season. Brian asks that everyone PLEASE keep the right-of-way areas trimmed and cleared. If you are working on a project that you feel the fire department should know about, give them a call.

Tidewater and Associates – Ed Foley says they have several small projects right now.

Town of Maysville – Town Manager Schumata Brown says they have a subdivision and RV park coming in. They are also working on replacing some water lines.

Stake Center – Bridgette says they have a new contract providing locate services in the area.

MetroNet – Marty Viser is the new construction and community relations manager and asks if you have any issues with MetroNet, please give her a call.

BADGER – Will Haag says they are a sub-contractor working in the area, mainly on Camp Lejeune right now providing hydrovac services and locating solutions.

Spectrum – Eric says they are installing fiber in Jones, Lenoir, and Duplin counties; getting ready to start in Pamlico County. They are staying very busy.

Mastek – Ryan says they are working in Jones County right now and staying busy.

PLURIS – Karen says they have RV parks, commercial units, apartment complexes, etc. coming in.

This meeting ended at 12:30 pm. There were 30 attendees at this meeting.
