- <u>Damage Reporting</u>: Remember that if you damage an underground utility, it is your responsibility to report this damage to NC 811 UCC. Offices in <u>Greensboro</u>.

- <u>ALWAYS!</u> If you hit an underground objective, and you think it is a <u>Gas Line</u>, do the following in this order:
  - Call 911 to report the accident!
  - <u>Call the Gas Company and let them know the specifics concerning</u> the damage!
  - Call 811 to report the accident to our office!

### Tami Groves – NC 811 Comments:

- Tami announced that Tyler Ross from Asheville will become the new NC811 UCC "western region" representative. He will probably begin meeting with us not later than, November 2022.
- The US Department of Transportation's Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) conducted an evaluation of North Carolina Utilities Commission's enforcement of the NC excavation damage prevention law. This

commission has determined that the NC Utilities Commission enforcement is "Adequate."

- At the last meeting of the Damage Review Board, there was a total of **19** damages review where fines were issued.
- Remember, if you request a locate via the telephone, use the call back feature if you are put on hold. It works well, and they will call you back!
- You MUST have voicemail if you call in a locate. This is because if a utility needs to get additional information, you will receive the message and can get back to them to help resolve any problems that may come up on the locate.
- <u>Important:</u> If you have damaged made to your systems, be sure and file a COMPLAINT. File the complaint against the parent company not the locator service provider. Remember, to take several photographs from various angles to be submitted with you written claim.

### Round-table Discussions:

<u>Kevin Clark – Brentwood Water:</u> We have just completed the Bradley Road replacement project which consists of 3,000 feet of new six-inch pipeline replacing an old outdated two-inch waterline. Currently make the new meter tie-ins from the old line to the new line. Have completed all but two-meter tie-ins. These two tie-ins are on hold until we get delivery of saddles to make the installation.

The supply lines are critical currently, much needed items are on backorder! We do not see any improvement for the near future.

We are having problems with the LKN Cable installers not getting locate properly done before they run their cable drops to the homes. They have damaged some of our underground systems.

We are also seeing delays on doing new taps this is also because of the short supply of materials.

<u>Chris Banietti - Badger Transportation:</u> Doing a lot of work in the Charlotte area. Just a lot going on! Real busy!

<u>Ken Suttles – Suttles Surveying:</u> Currently working in Marion, had a gas line leak where a contractor hit the service line. It took almost two hours to get the gas cut off. The area had been located, but they still hit the line!

David Poore – West Consultants, Inc.": Nothing to report.

**Richard Lawrence & Mark Killian – PNG – Duke-Energy:** (Richard) - Dealing with several leaks caused by underground direct boring. (Mark) – Will beginning an exceptionally large project near the county line at the Castle Bridge just north of the Town of Rutherford College. This is a DOT project of moving a gas line which will be bored under the Catawba River. This move is to allow for the demolition and replacement of bridge going over the river at this sight.

Just a reminder: That at the last meeting, it was decided to CANCEL the December 2022 meeting, because of the holidays. Please mark your calendars with this change!





Locator LOGiX is a web-based locate management system designed for utilities and utility locators to manage their utility line locate requests sent by North Carolina 811.
















# LOCATE REQUESTS IN NORTH CAROLINA
