Creating a Damage Ticket vs. Reporting damages with Dirt Lite



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Report a Damage

It is the LAW for excavators to report damages to NC811 and the facility owner/operator. At this time, this can only be done by calling 811 to speak with an NC811 representative.

DIRT LITE

DIRT Lite is solely used by the member facility owner/operator to report an incident that occurred to their facility only; **member facility owners must contact NC811 directly** in the event they have caused a damage to another member facility owner/operator's facilities.

If the damage resulted in a violation of the Underground Utility Safety & Damage Prevention Act, please report the alleged violation.



Safety topic given by Jimmy Gray. Lightning safety. Make sure if there is a danger of lightning to get in a safe spot. Stay away from open spaces, water sources, and tall objects (trees). Get into a building if possible.

811 presentation given by Tami Groves

Dominion -has 25 miles worth of pipeline that is being fast tracked. The 12" steel line will by on road shoulder for most of the way. Working on right of way acquisition and educating the citizens. Having a concern with a contractor who indicates they are white lining but it area is not marked. Tami Groves will reach out.

Southern Cross – Staying busy with Dominion. No concerns at this time.

One question-is the Duke Fiber project still coming to Kannapolis. Tami reached out to Dan Bare with Duke. There is a project on the board but no construction timeline as of now.

Piedmont Natural Gas – working on retiring Line One next year. Will be retiring line in Mt Ulla and on 274. Replacing lines and getting gas back to customers.

USIC – Obv work is very busy. Jon Elzy is also part of the USIC Safety Committee. Be aware of your surroundings. Not just for yourself, your co-workers, but also contractors and general public. There was an individual killed several weeks ago in a 16' deep trench. Look out for everyone.

SEC – working several projects for Piedmont Natural Gas in the area and project on 85 in Rowan.
