


County Ticket Volume

Distribution









Neill Grading – Very busy time. Gaston/Lincoln grading jobs. Book walk portion of the walk in Hickory. Apartment complex on Startown. Subdivision off Startown at Trivium.

Mike Wilson has left the company. Jan will be doing some extra work finishing projects. Check out their website about drone work they are doing.

Colliers Engineering and Design – David Talbert spoke about Project Atlas. Would like to have a contact with the City of Hickory and Newton. Drones are great.

Heath Consultants – One person in training in Lenoir. One to hire for fiber work. Hoping for no damages and keeping ahead of work.

Roddi Long Grading – Working on several projects for Dominion Energy. Working in Taylorsville, Bessemer City, and Mooresville.

Piedmont Natural Gas – Four NCDOT relocates. Hwy 321 widening. 321 in Hudson. They are a year from work there. 8" steel moving in May. About two years from boring at the river. I40 at Lenoir Rhyne Blvd to go to construction in 2025. Still in the planning stages. Denver/Sherrills Ford Hwy 150 started construction at Mt. Pleasant Road on new subdivision. Sherrills Ford 2k+ subdivision putting in an 8". On maintenance side repairing cut lines, relocates. Transmission/high pressure leak survey done for the year.

It is important for everyone to remember that a Code 55 means that the respective gas companies must be on site.
