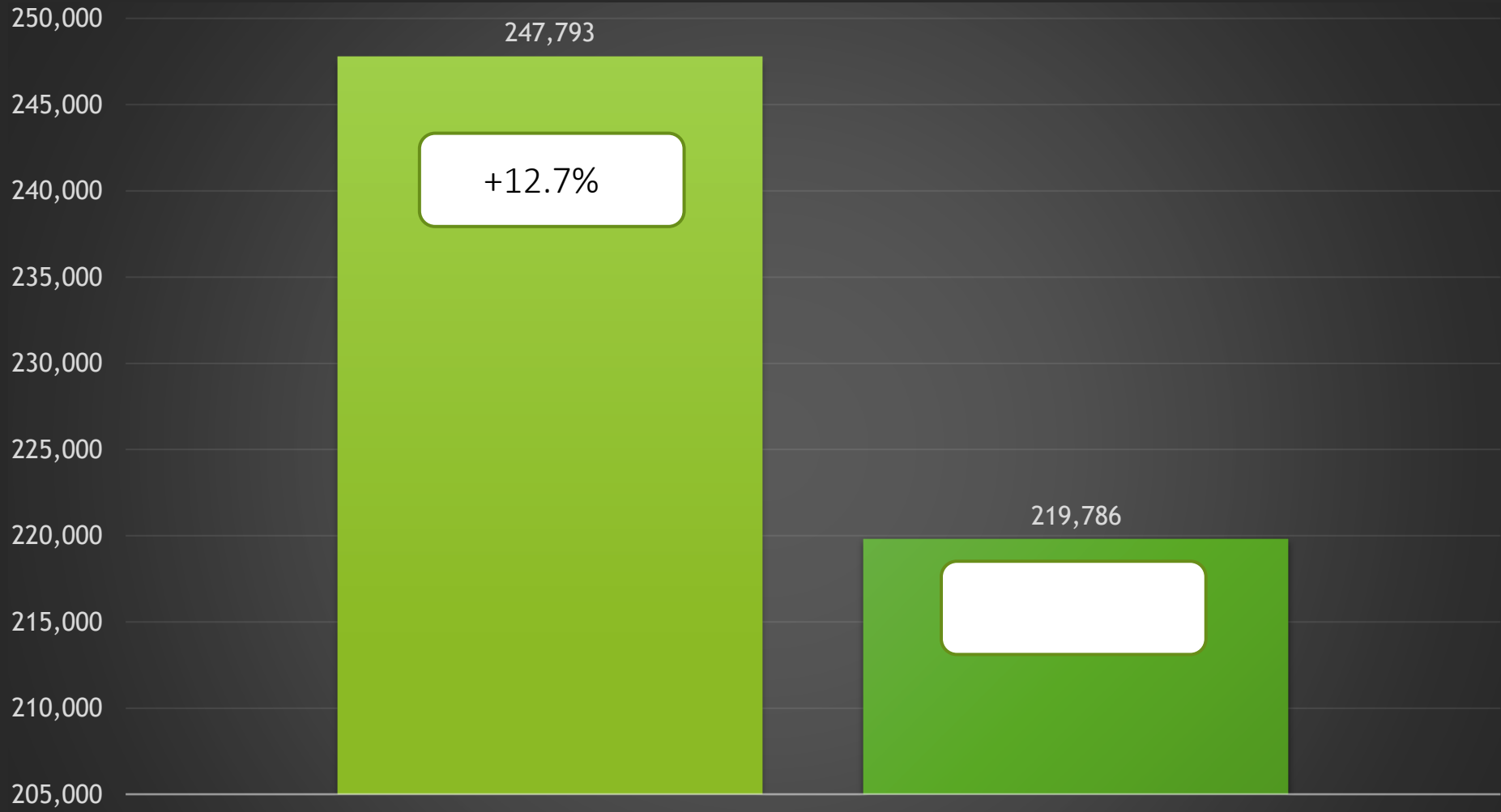

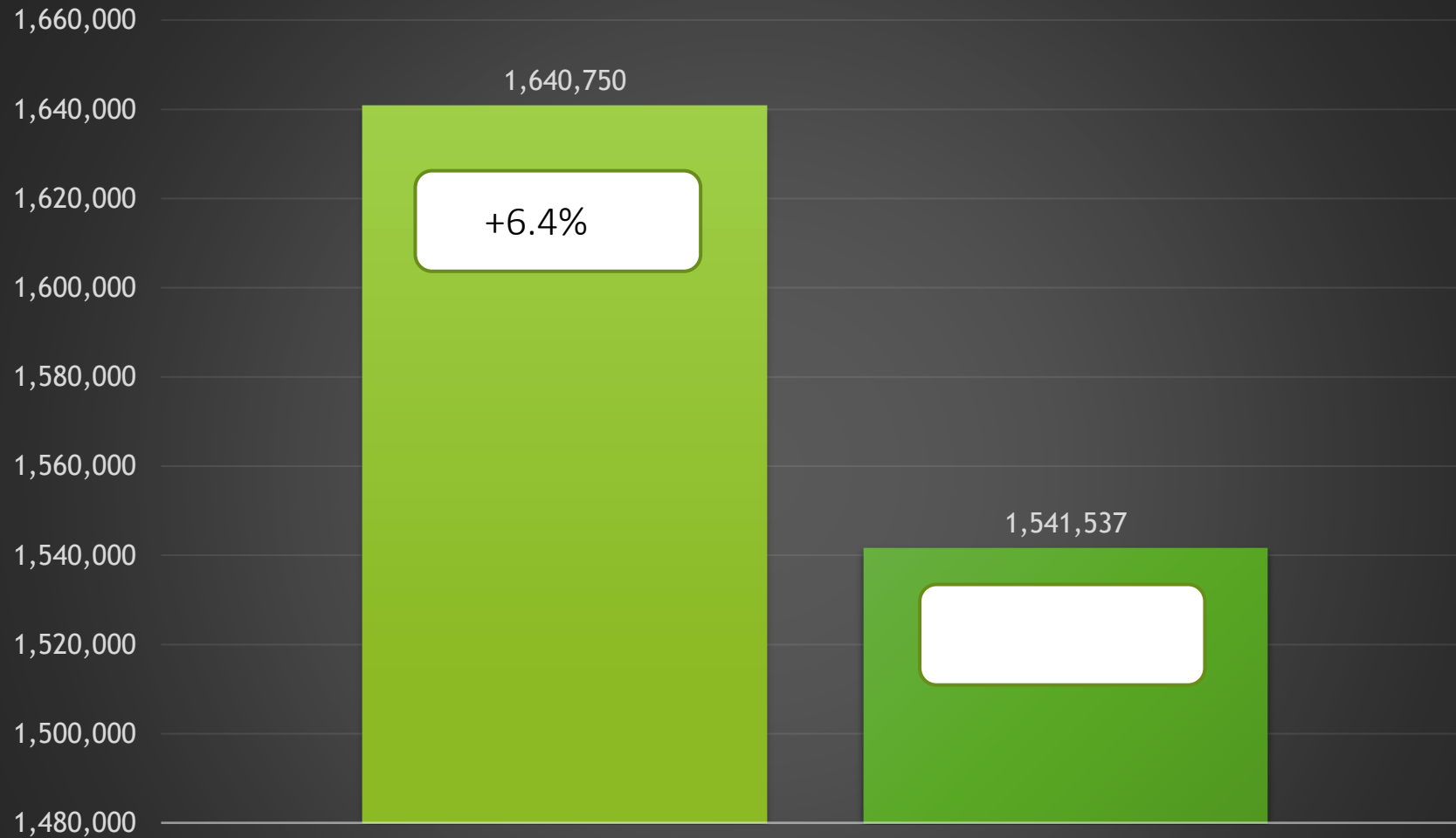

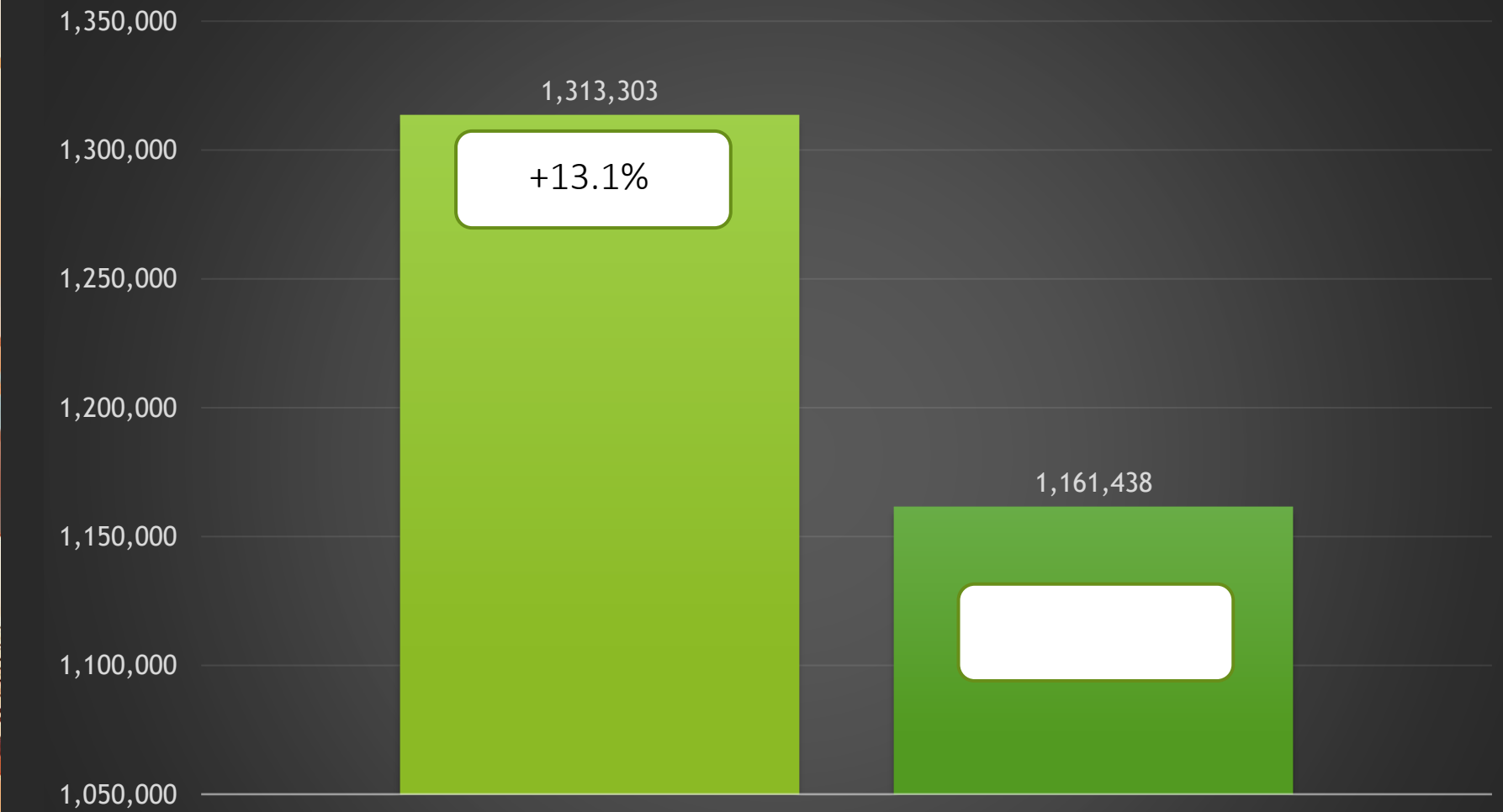

Transmissions for NC - July 24 vs 23



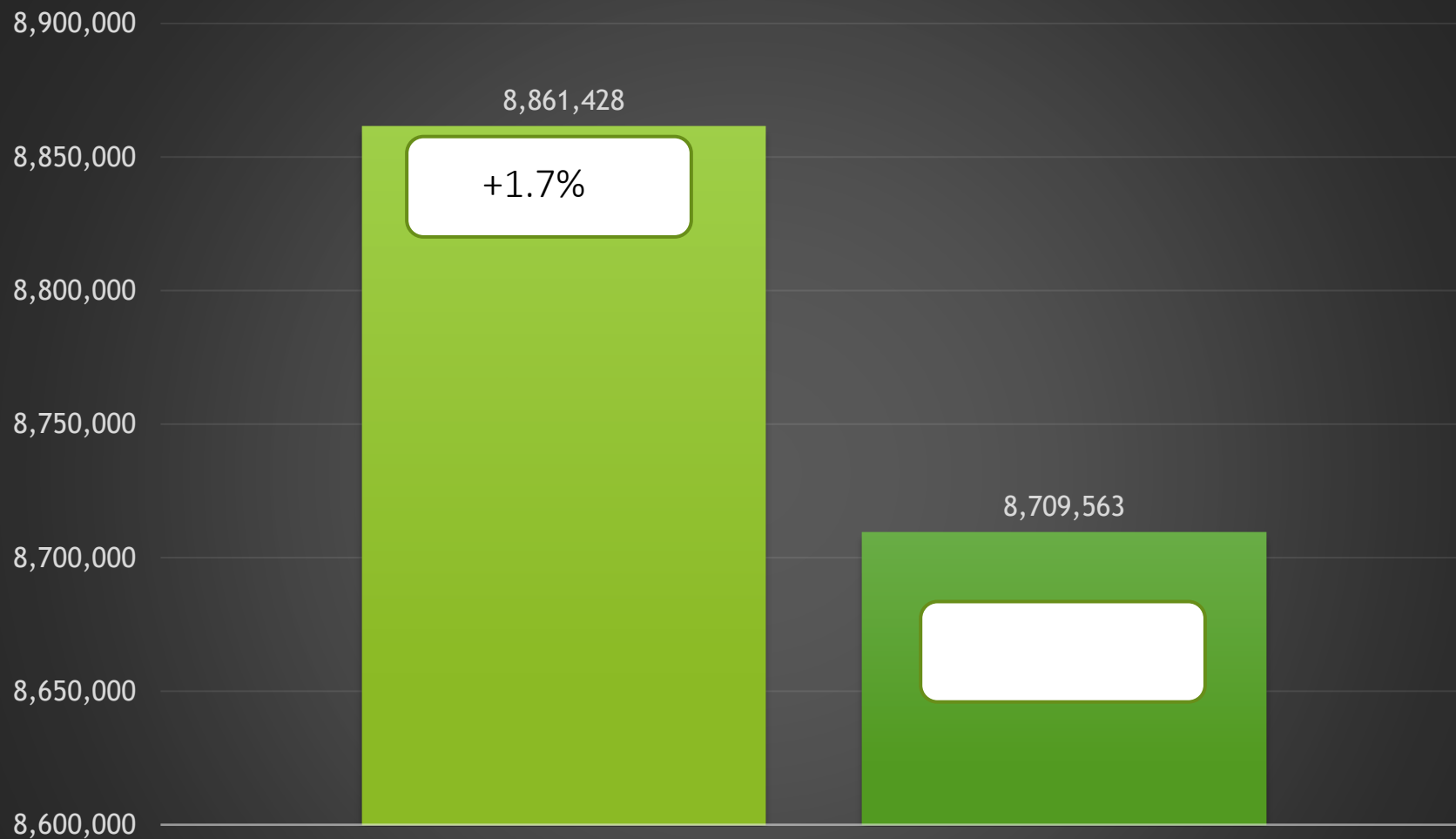

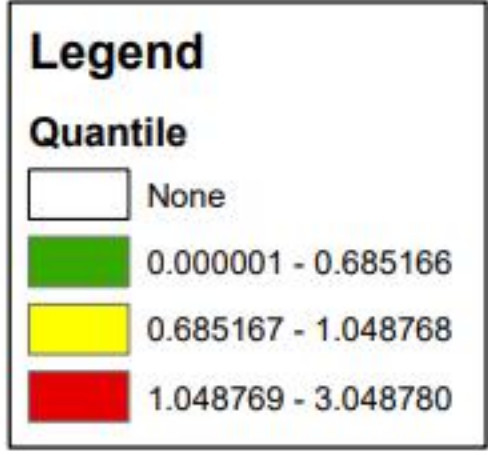

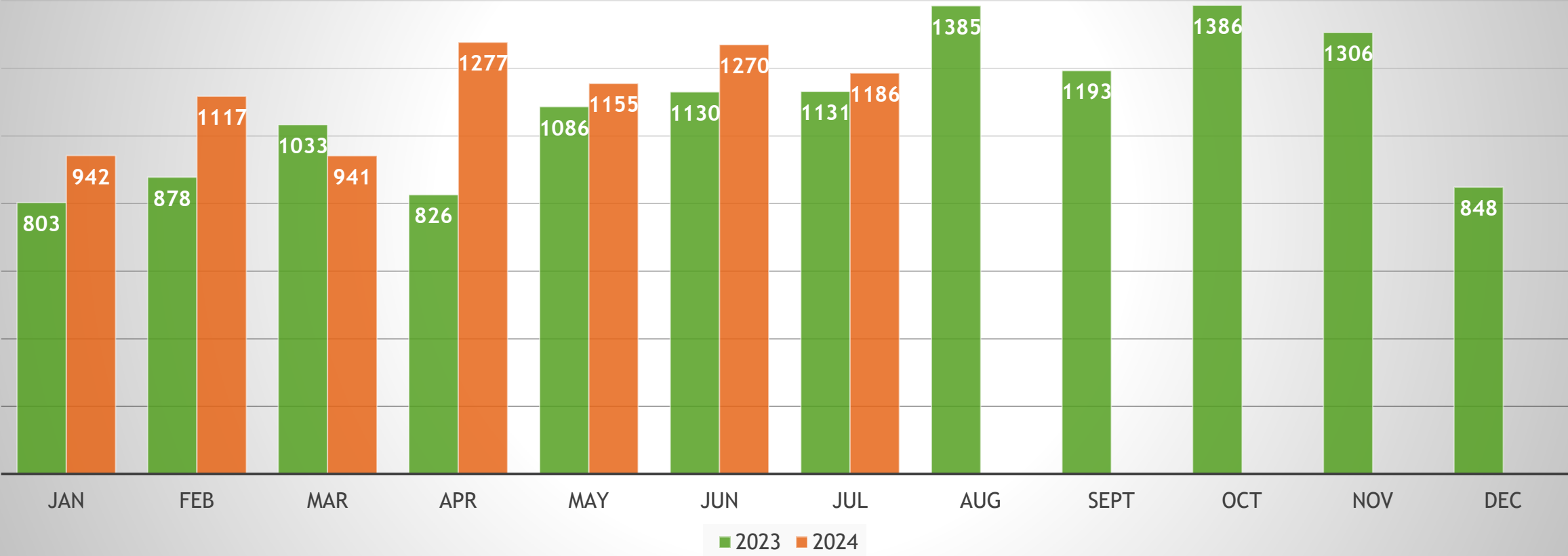
