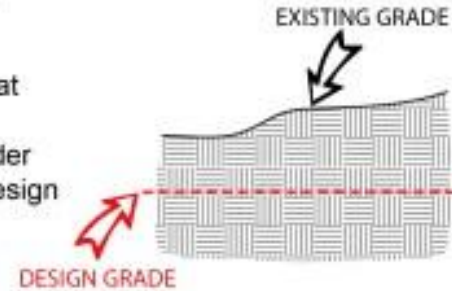

Land Development 101

ROUGH GRADING TERMS

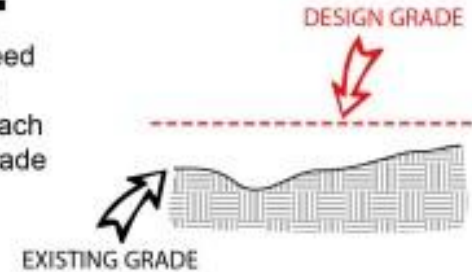
1. CUT

Existing dirt that needs to be removed in order to reach the design grade below.

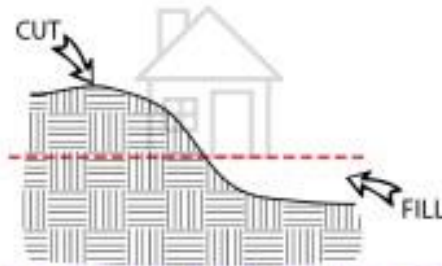


2. FILL

Areas that need to be filled in with dirt to reach the design grade above.



3. TRANSITION LOT



A lot where both a "cut" and a "fill" occur.

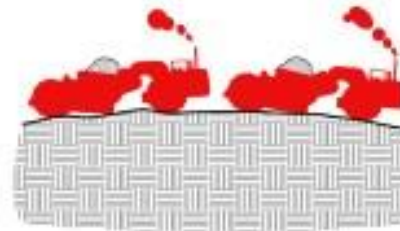
4. SITE CLEARING/DEMO



Removal of all vegetation, roots, trash, and other debris on site prior to the rough grade beginning.

5. MASS EXCAVATION

The removal and transportation of large volumes of dirt using large pieces of equipment (scrapers).



6. OVER-EXCAVATION

Additional excavation beyond the design grade in order to prep a solid foundation for houses or other structures.

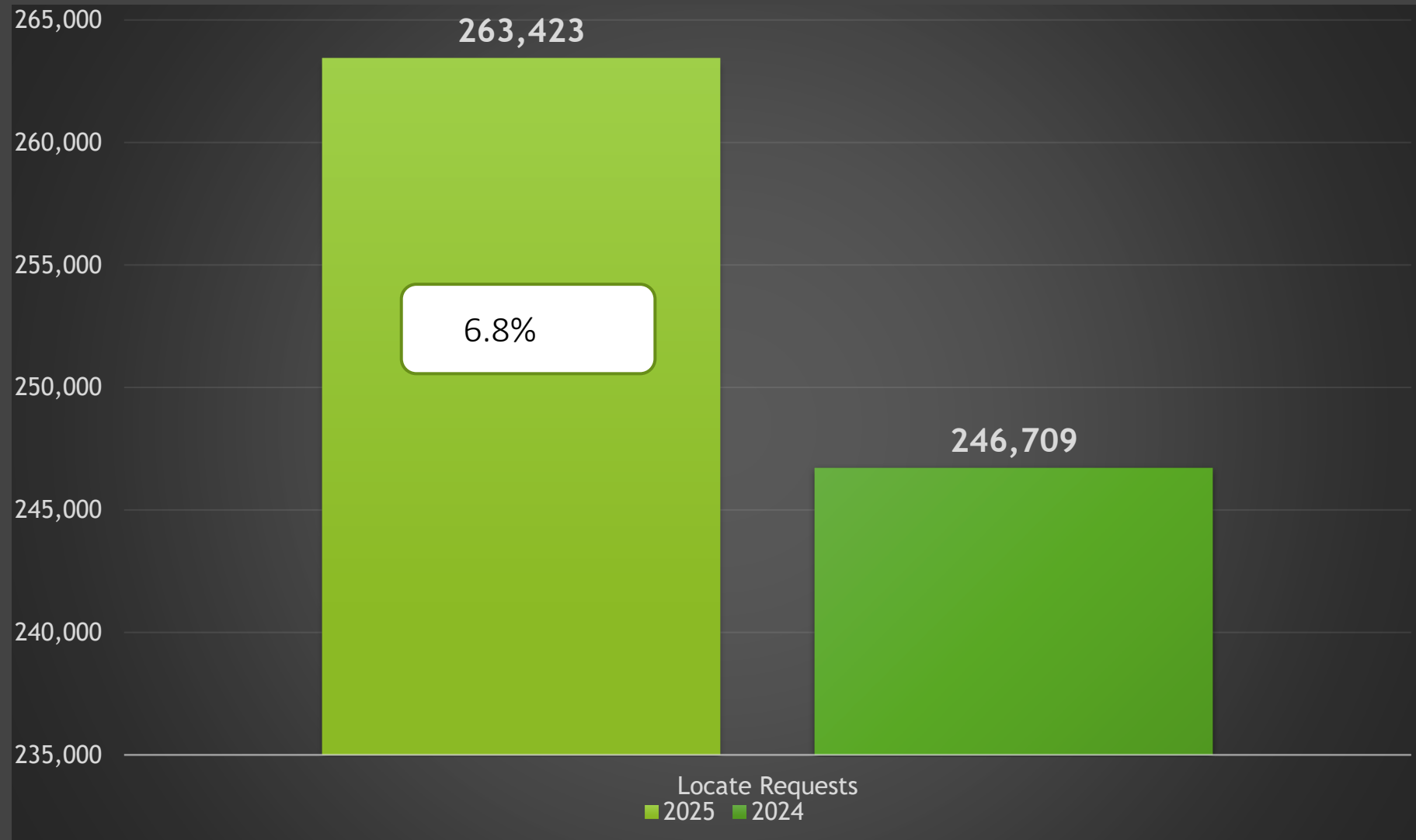
Locate Requests for NC - MAY 25 vs 24



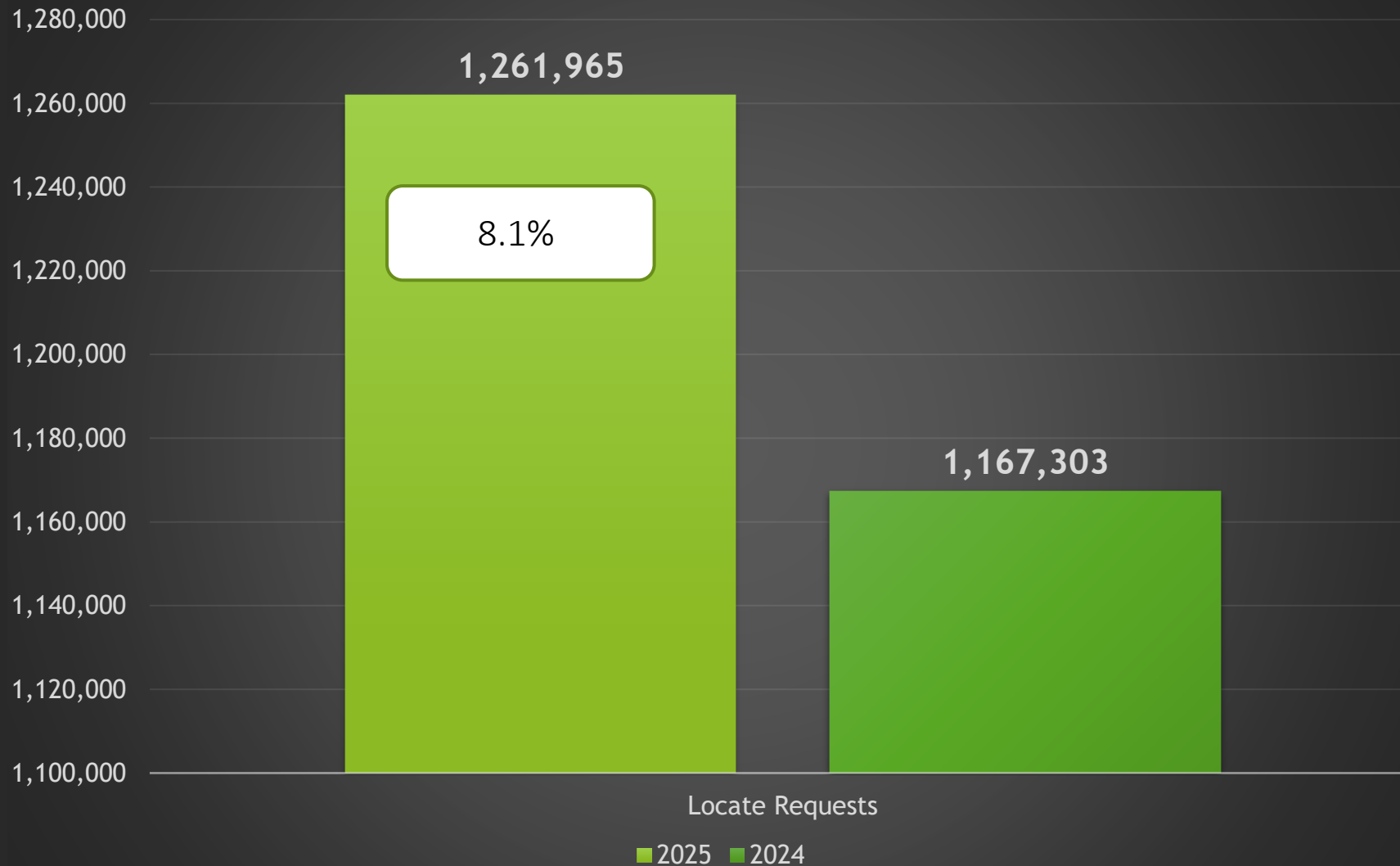
May, 2025 - 263,423 / 2024 - 246,709 = (6.8%)

Locate Requests for NC - YTD



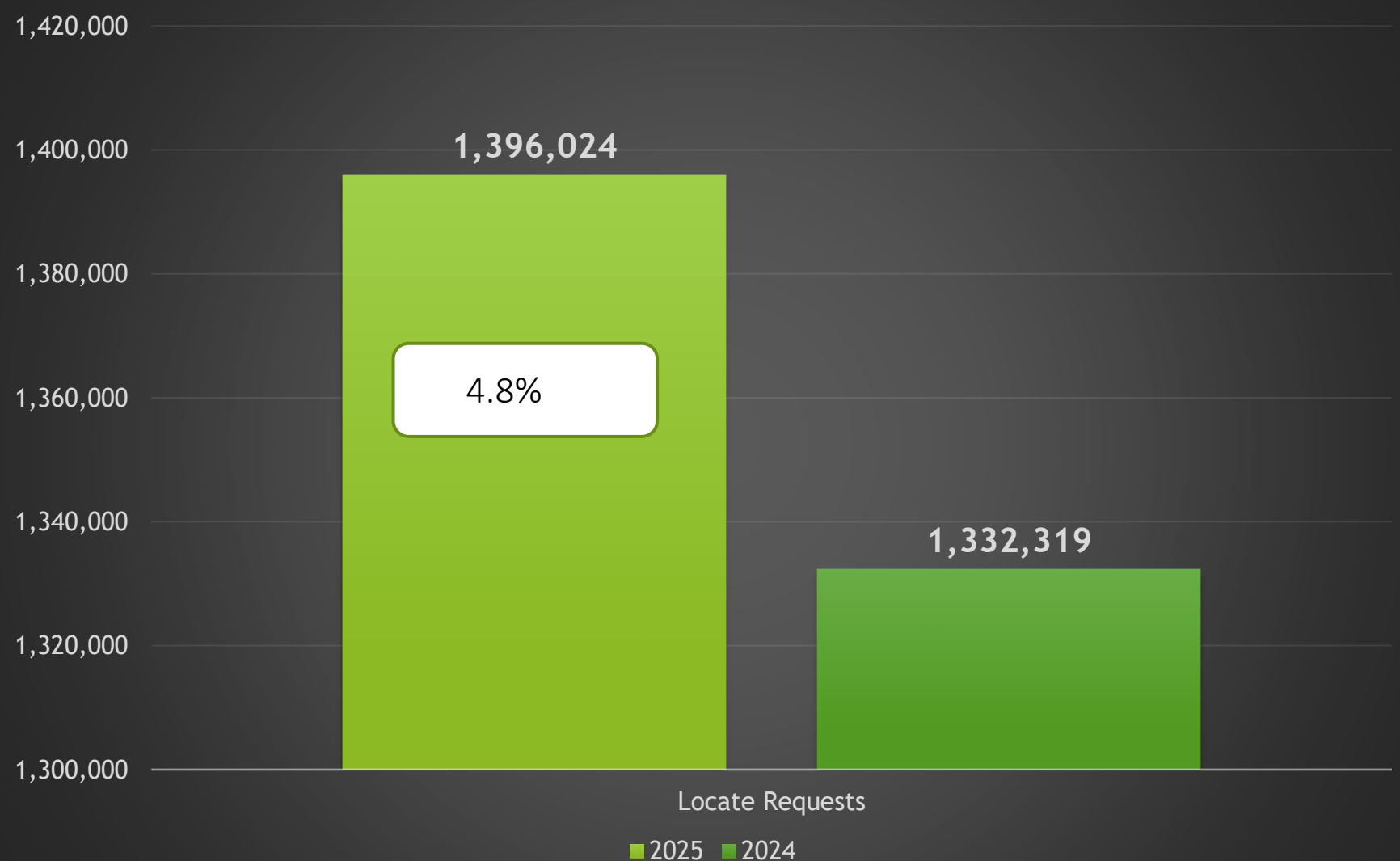
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Transmissions for NC - MAY 25 vs 24

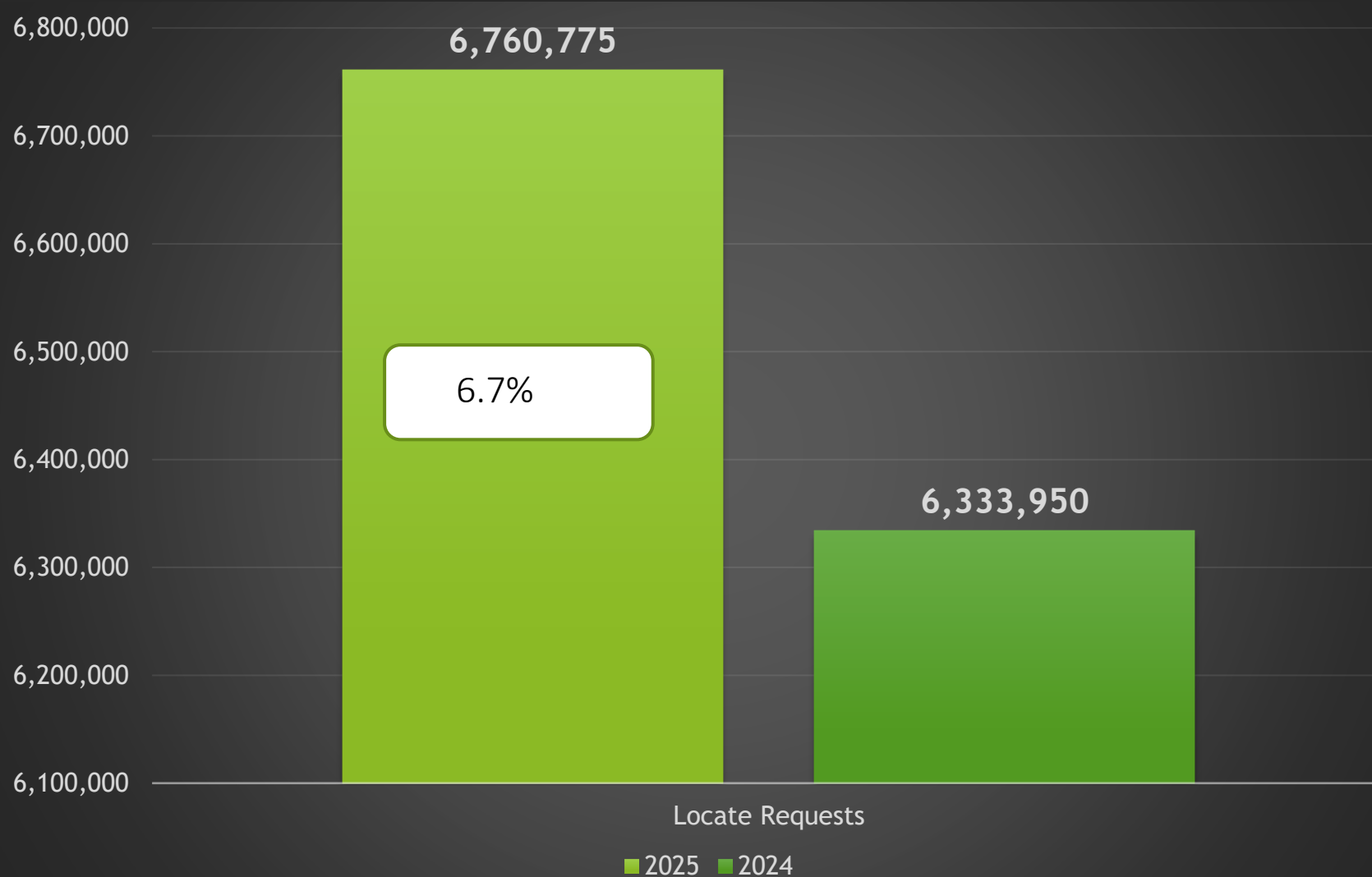

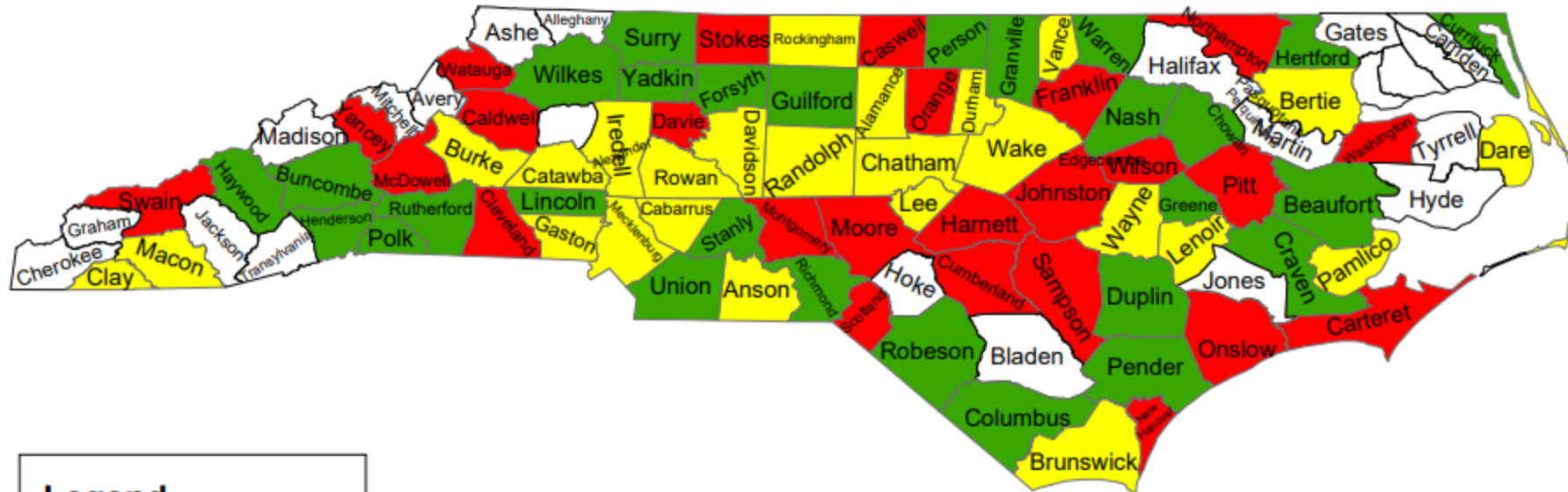

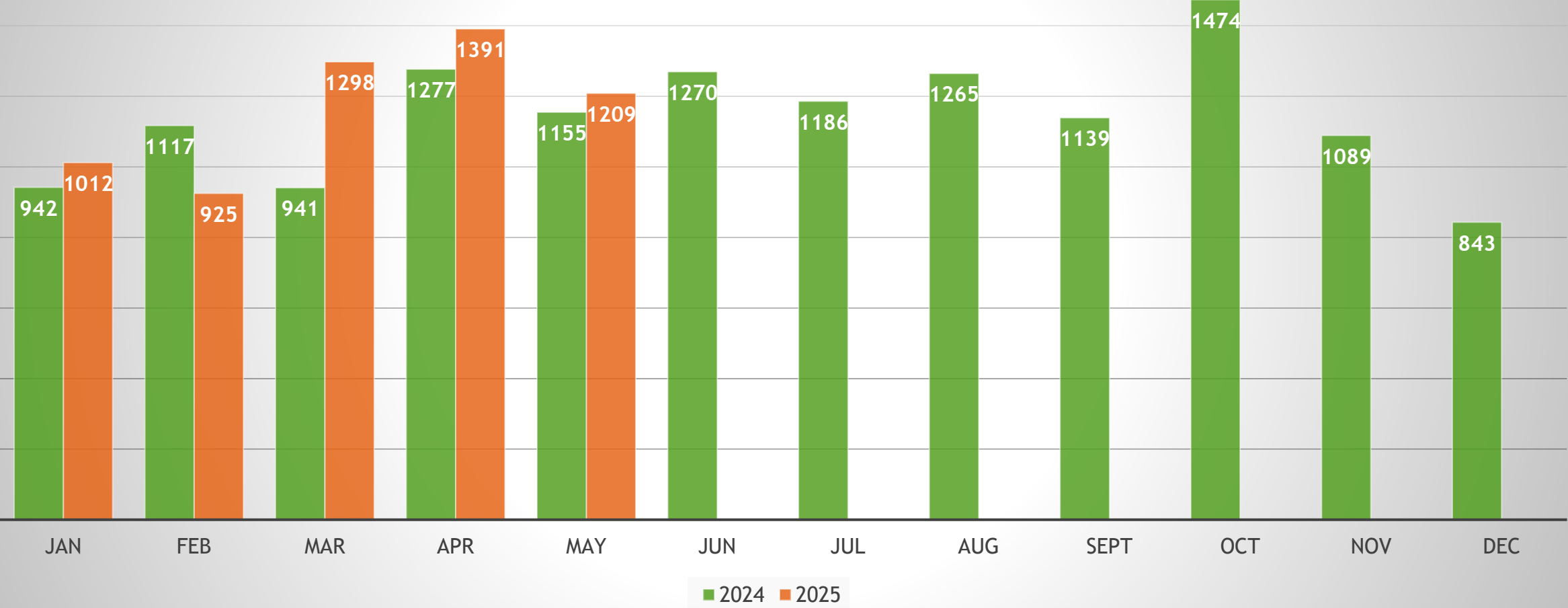

PLEASE NOTE

If the diameter or width of the facility is greater than four inches, the dimension of the facility shall be indicated at least every 50 feet in the area of the proposed excavation or demolition. An operator who operates multiple facilities in the area of the proposed excavation or demolition shall locate each facility.

The operator's identity, marked as provided in subdivision (1) of this subsection, in the area where the proposed excavation or demolition is to occur. At a minimum, the operator's identity shall be marked at the beginning point, at intervals of 200 linear feet, and at the end point of the proposed excavation or demolition.

Discussion:

NC811 report: Parrish went over the upcoming events for June and July. He also mentioned that they still have about 15 tailgate wraps available for free. He reminded everyone that Grading is excavation and requires a locate. Overall locate tickets were up 8.1% from last year. Harnett County had a 21.6% increase in new locates YTD and Johnston County had a 51% increase. Hyper Networks LLC was the top caller for Harnett County and SC Telecom was the top caller in Johnston County in May. There were 31 damages reported in Harnett County and 59 in Johnston County in May. New law changes will probably go into effect around October 1st. He stressed the importance of putting your operator ID when locating your lines.

Andrew reminded everyone to white line and to be specific on your locates, he also asked everyone to be aware of overhead lines they are working around. He encouraged everyone to attend the monthly meetings and ask your contractors to attend as well; he then adjourned the meeting.
