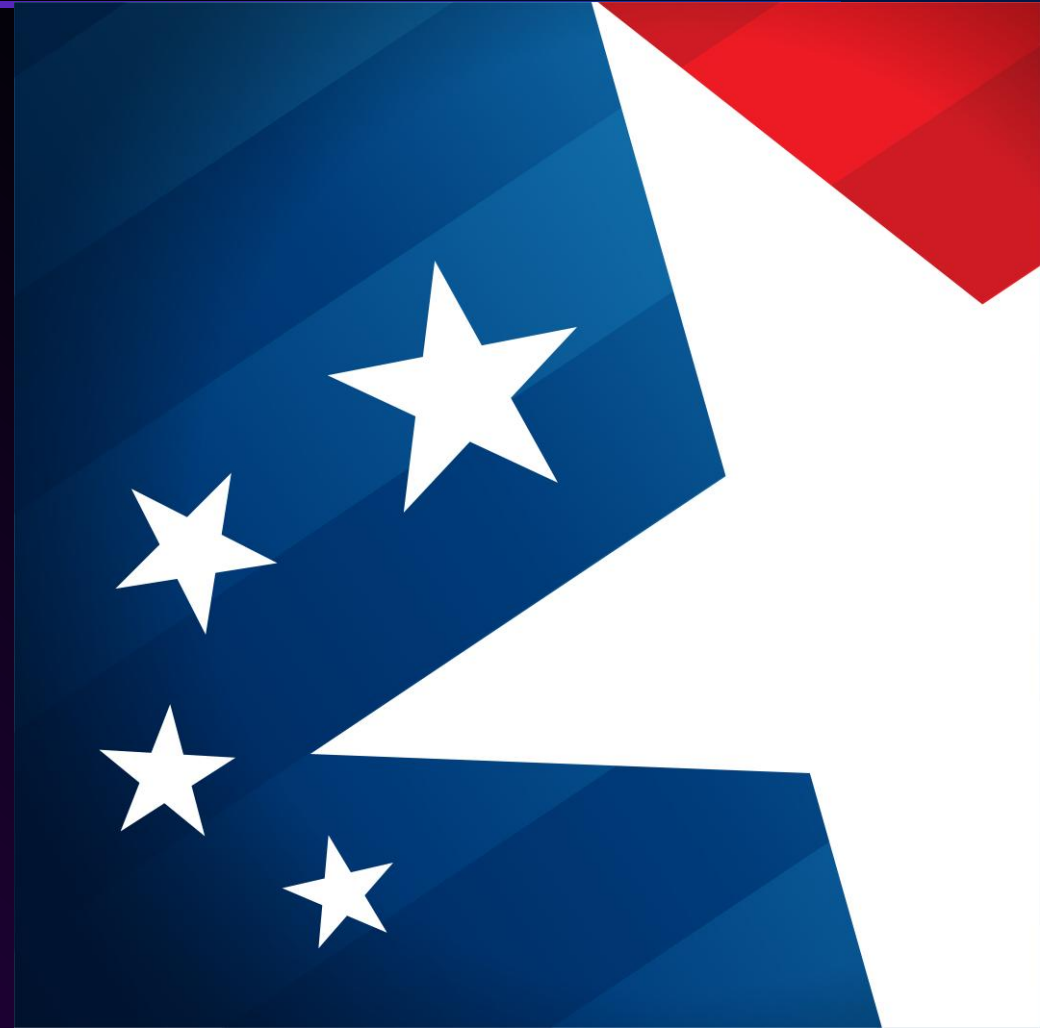

CHANGES TO HOUSE BILL 247

SESSION 2025

AN ACT TO UPDATE THE UNDERGROUND UTILITY SAFETY AND DAMAGE PREVENTION ACT.

- Changes to the law will go into effect October 1st, 2025

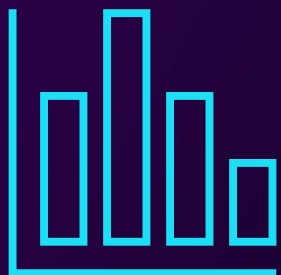

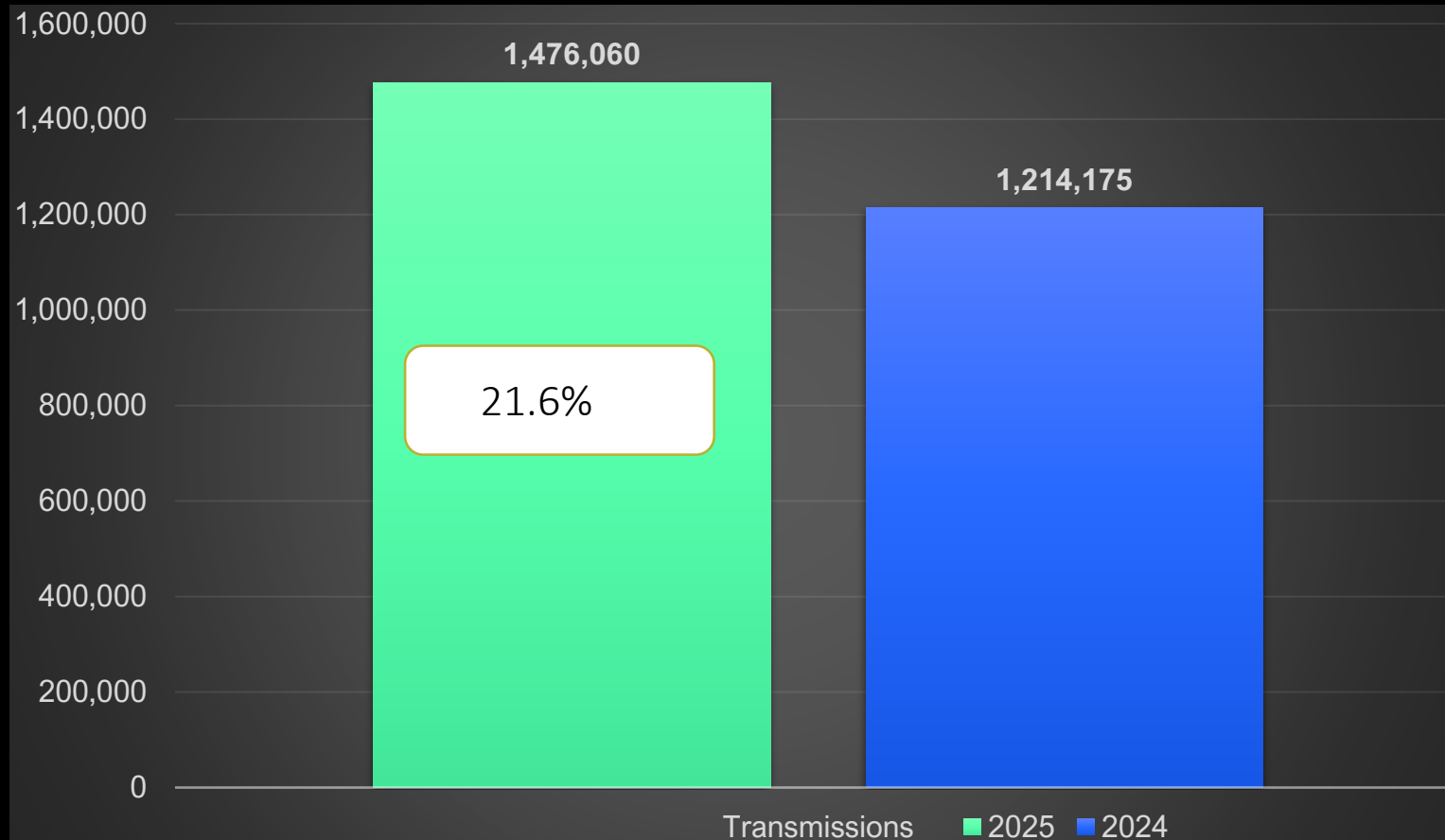

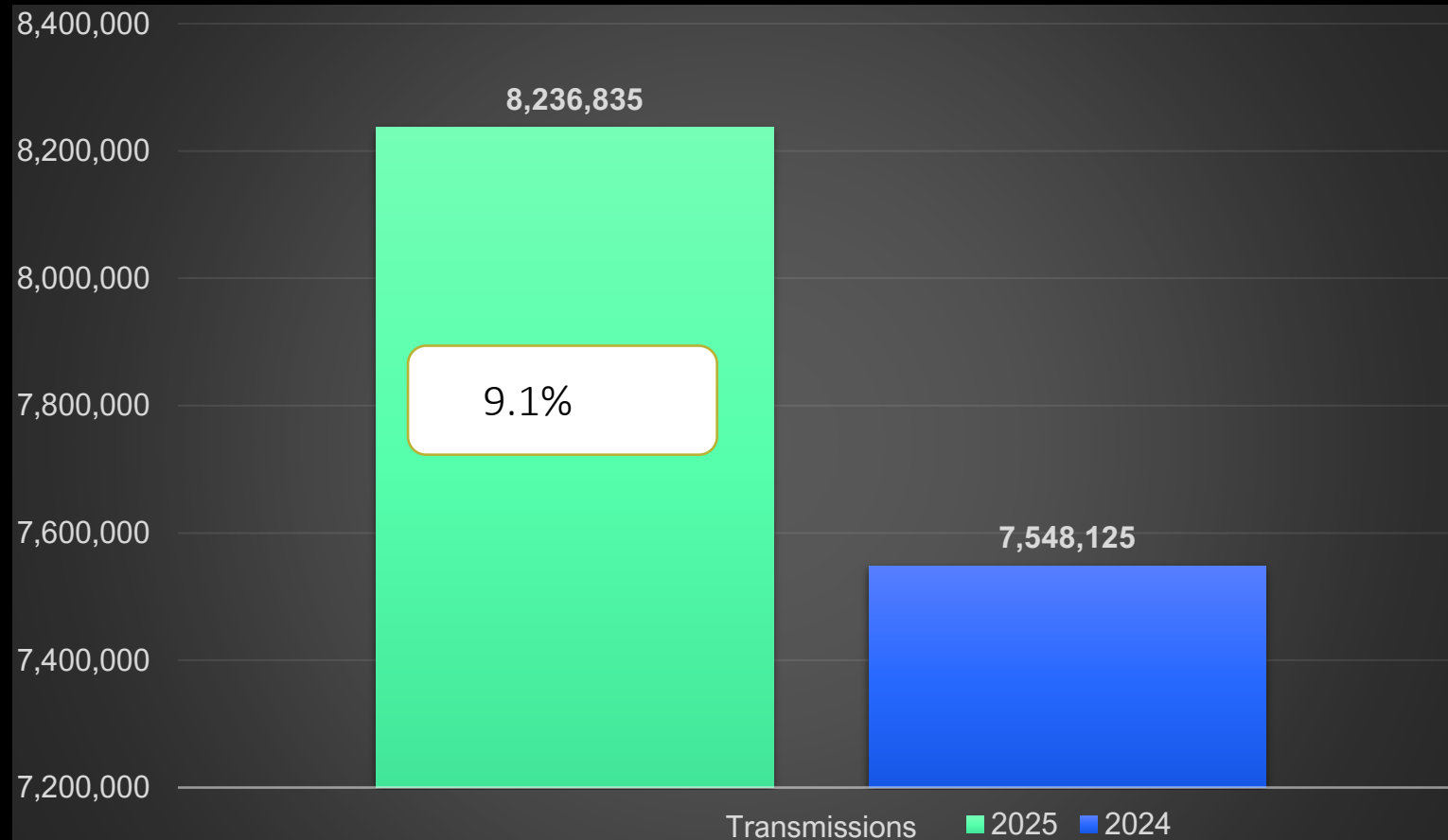
TRANSMISSIONS FOR NC JUNE 25 VS 24



June, 2025 - 1,476,060 / 2024 - 1,214,175 = (21.6%)

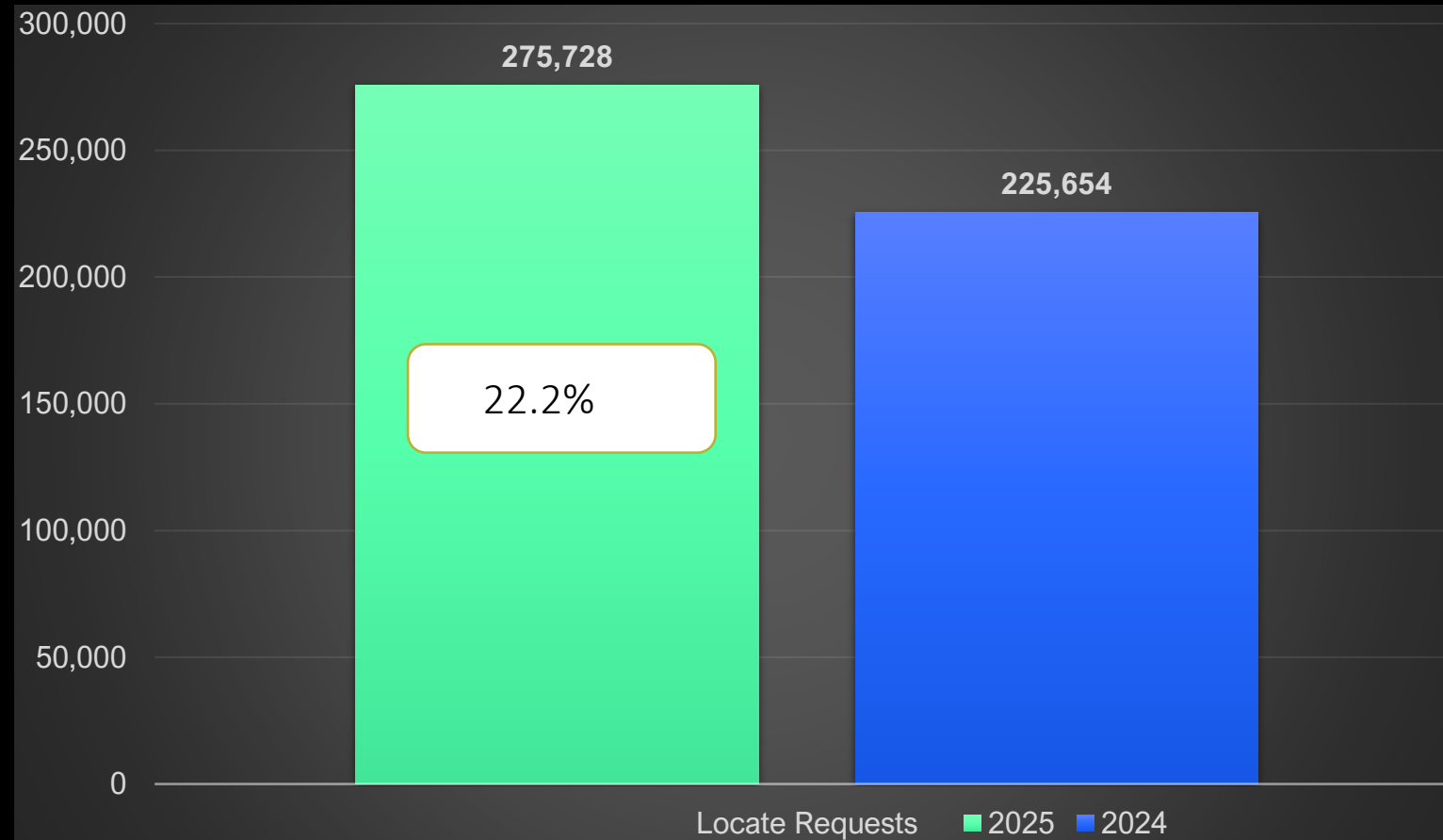

LOCATE REQUESTS FOR NC JUNE 25 VS 24



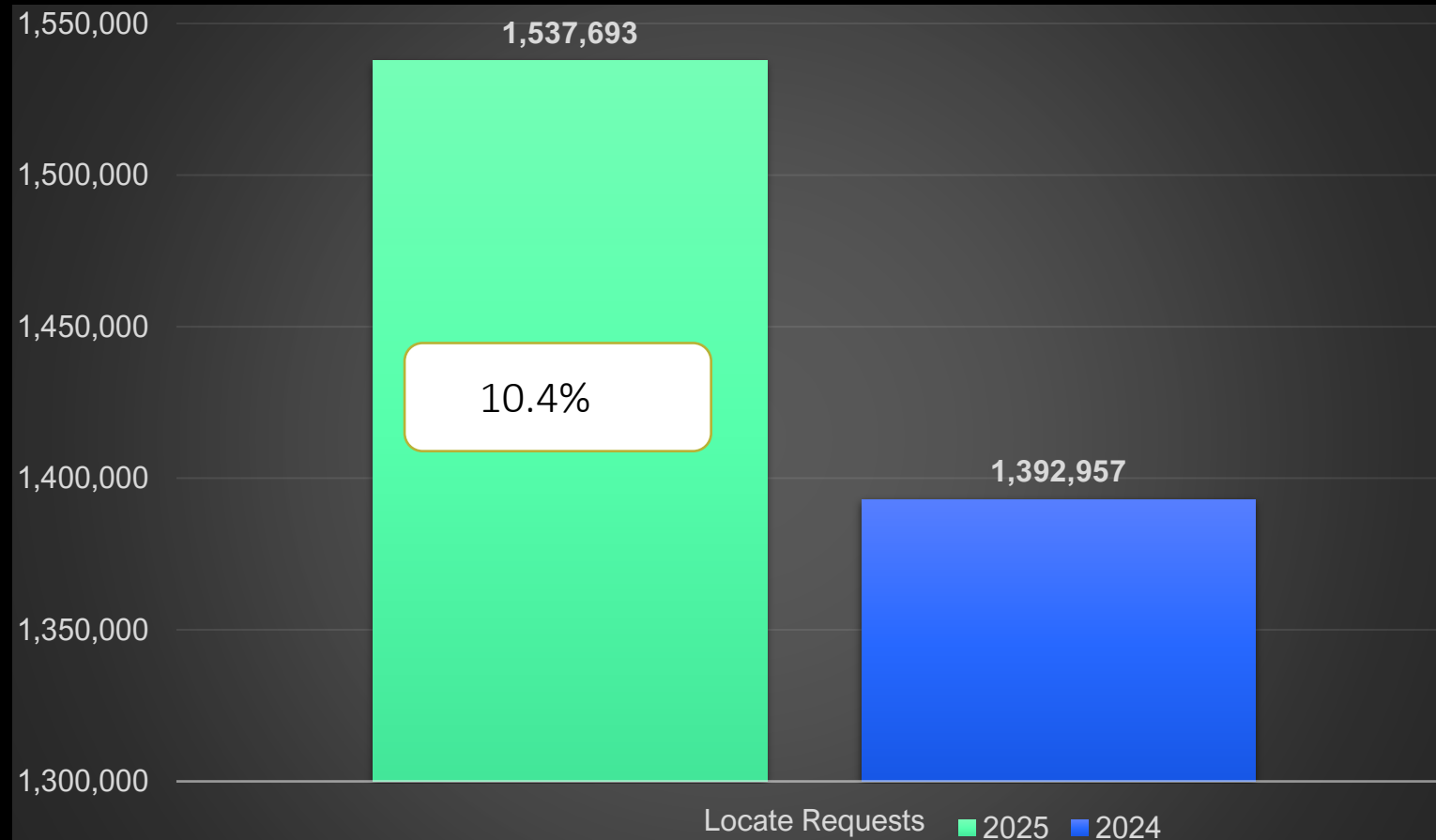

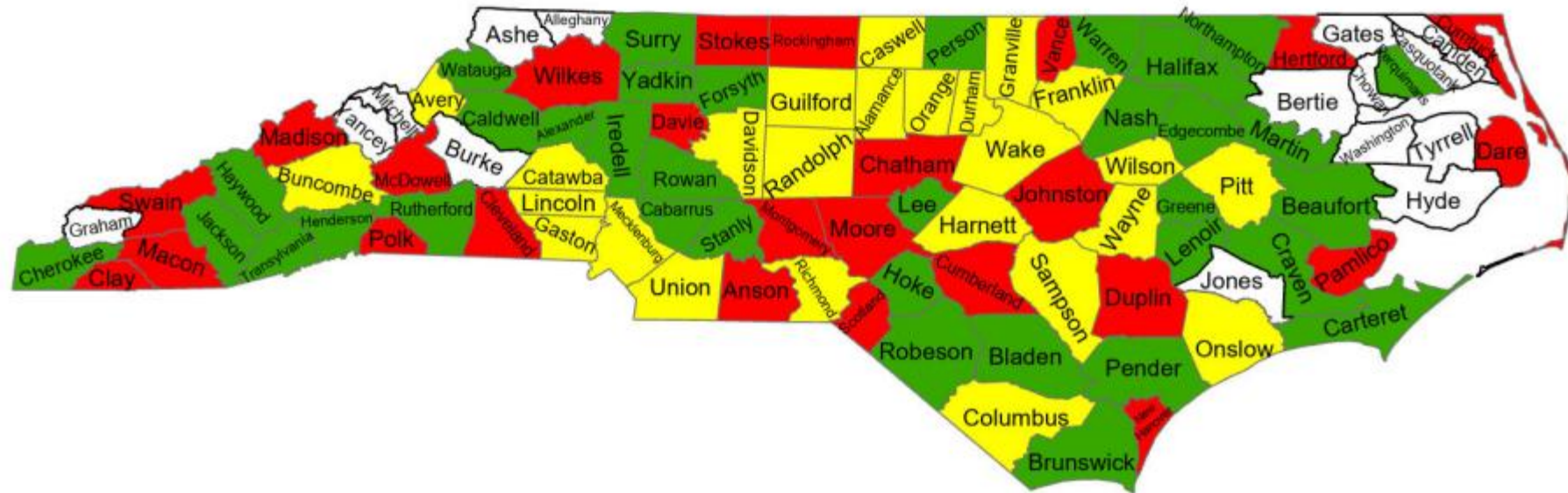

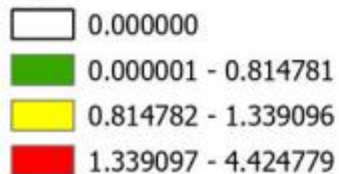
DAMAGES PER 1,000 TRANSMISSIONS

JUNE 2025



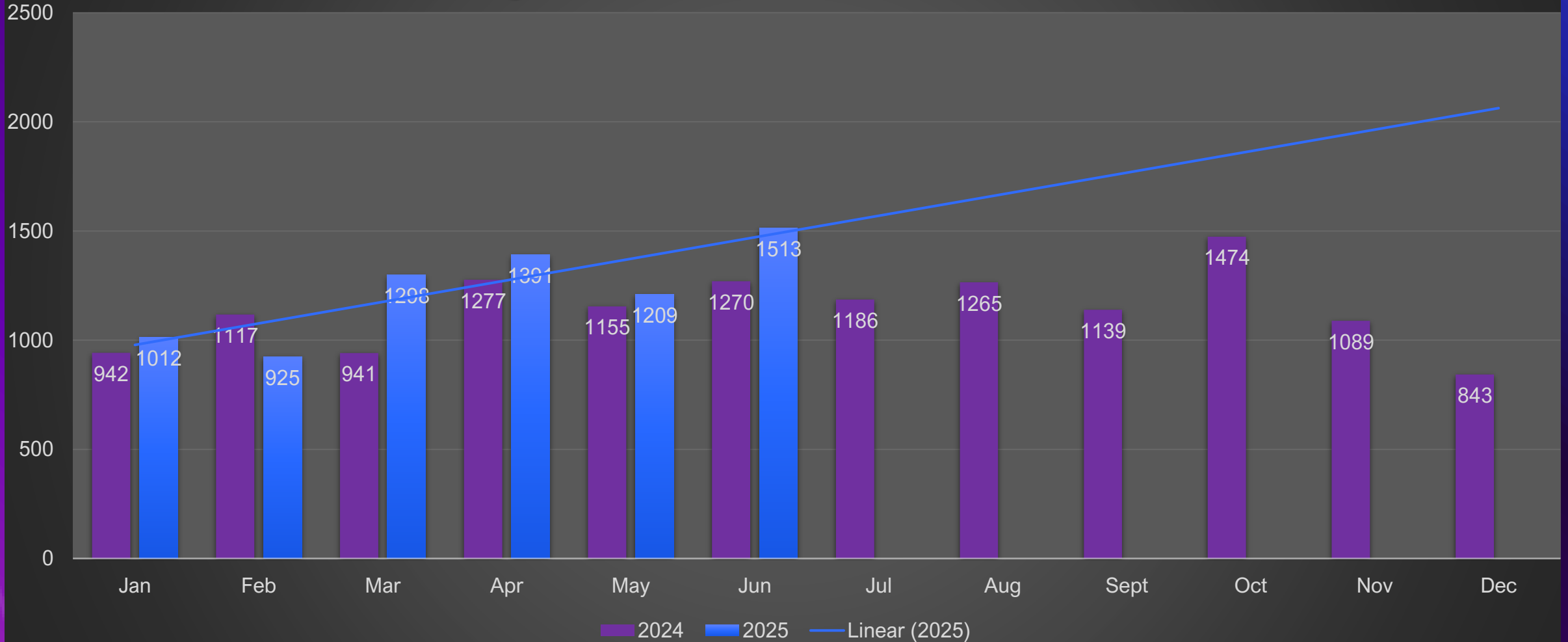
