



- Alert workers to the heat index anticipated for the day and identify each precaution in place at the work site to reduce the risk of heat-related illness
- Provide plenty of cool drinking water and disposable cups
- Actively encourage workers to drink small amounts of water often
- Establish and enforce work/rest schedules
- Set up a buddy system
- Maintain effective communication with your crew at all times
- Encourage workers to wear sunscreen and use other protections from direct sunlight

CHANGES TO HOUSE BILL 247 SESSION 2025


AN ACT TO UPDATE THE UNDERGROUND UTILITY SAFETY AND DAMAGE PREVENTION ACT.


TRANSMISSIONS FOR NC JUNE 25 VS 24


TRANSMISSIONS FOR NC YEAR TO DATE


















Damages in North Carolina 2025 vs 2024
