

CHANGES TO HOUSE BILL 247 SESSION 2025


AN ACT TO UPDATE THE UNDERGROUND UTILITY SAFETY AND DAMAGE PREVENTION ACT.






TRANSMISSIONS FOR NC JUNE 25 VS 24


TRANSMISSIONS FOR NC YEAR TO DATE
