

**Haywood UCC Meeting Notes:**

**Date:** November 3rd, 2025

**Location:** Red Fox, Waynesville, NC

**Attendees:** Representatives from Enbridge Gas, NCDOT, and NC811

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**1. Call to Order and Welcome**

The meeting was opened with a warm welcome to attendees, followed by introductions and a brief overview of the importance of continued collaboration within the utility coordination community.

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**2. Project and Utility Updates**

- **Enbridge Gas**

Representatives from Enbridge Gas announced plans to **retire the gas line in Canton** that formerly serviced the old paper mill site. This marks a significant infrastructure change, and stakeholders were encouraged to coordinate as necessary to support the transition and avoid potential conflicts.

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**3. Improving Engagement and Attendance**

A collaborative discussion focused on **reinvigorating attendance** and engagement at future UCC meetings. All attendees acknowledged the importance of inviting and encouraging participation from key local entities who have historically been involved but have not attended recent meetings. These include:

- Town of Clyde
- Town of Canton
- Town of Waynesville
- Junaluska Sanitary District
- AT&T

It was agreed that **personal outreach and emphasizing the meetings' role in fostering inter-agency communication and safety** could help reestablish consistent participation.

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#### **4. Meeting Purpose and Value Discussion**

The group shared reflections on the **positive impact UCC meetings have on communication, planning, and preventing utility damage**. By bringing stakeholders together regularly, these meetings serve as a proactive forum for sharing upcoming projects, discussing coordination challenges, and fostering mutual accountability.

The message was clear: **Stronger attendance leads to stronger communication**, which ultimately supports safer digging practices and more efficient utility management across Haywood County.

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#### **5. Closing Remarks**

The meeting concluded with a reminder of the next scheduled UCC meeting and an open invitation for all utilities and municipalities to re-engage. Attendees were thanked for their time, and the value of continued collaboration was reiterated.
