






Attendees: Representatives from various stakeholders in underground utility coordination. _____

1. Call to Order and Welcome The meeting was opened with a warm welcome to attendees, followed by introductions and a brief overview of the importance of continued collaboration within the utility coordination community.

2. Project and Utility Updates -No new project Updates.

3. Improving Engagement and Attendance A collaborative discussion focused on reinvigorating attendance and engagement at future UCC meetings. All attendees acknowledged the importance of inviting and encouraging participation from key local entities who have historically been involved but have not attended recent meetings.

4. Meeting Purpose and Value Discussion The group shared reflections on the positive impact UCC meetings have on communication, planning, and preventing utility damage.
